

Dear Ct State Senate, I reside in Madison and I don't want any kind of fracturing waste (including hydraulic fracturing waste) being processed in CT or entering it. This waste has been causing serious problems in other states and is being exported out of fracking states to be stored and processed elsewhere. Loopholes in regulations mean that dangerous waste can be brought in under cover of processed products like road melter and construction fill. The waste is dangerous to wells, water, soil and people. Spillages frequently occur during transport. I want a state-wide ban on fracking, allowing fracked gas to travel through CT pipes, and processing of fracked waste from other states in our state. So far, our state has not passed meaningful laws to protect us from toxic hazards, and toxic waste processing plants here have allowed many violations to occur.
