**AN ACT CONCERNING COLLABORATIVE ARRANGEMENTS BETWEEN
PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS AND PHYSICIANS.**

Honorable members of the Committee,

As Co-Chair of the Health and Policy Committee for The Connecticut Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Society, I stand to oppose SB 300, an Act Concerning Collaborative Arrangements Between Physician Assistants and Physicians. This bill should be placed through due process within the Scope of Practice Review, for presentation of detailed evidence of the education and practice of this supervised and delegated health profession. With such Scope Review, the Connecticut citizens will have the privilege of knowing that due process was held in the state level licensure and practice law of the professional assistants to physicians.

The Connecticut residents are deemed to have their health professionals process a Scope of Practice Review through the Department of Public Health, as was managed for SB 36 of 2014 for Advanced Practice Registered Nurses, to depict the educational and practice standards. Within SB 300, the educational standards and evidence of practice is not succinct. Consider the due process necessary for this bill.
