***AN ACT REQUIRING EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF
CERTAIN QUASI-PUBLIC AGENCY CONTRACTS.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2018, and applicable to contracts*
2 *entered into or renewed on and after said date*) (a) For the purposes of this
3 section, "quasi-public agency" has the same meaning as provided in
4 section 1-120 of the general statutes and "contract" means any
5 employment contract, consulting contract or separation agreement that
6 a quasi-public agency intends to enter into or renew.

7 (b) On and after October 1, 2018, each quasi-public agency shall
8 submit a copy of all contracts to the Attorney General for review and
9 comment prior to entering into or renewing any such contract. If such
10 contract has an annual cost of over one hundred thousand dollars, the
11 quasi-public agency shall, at the time of submission of such contract to
12 the Attorney General, also submit a copy of such contract to the joint
13 standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of
14 such quasi-public agency, in accordance with the provisions of section

15 11-4a of the general statutes. The provisions of this section shall not
16 apply to any third-party consulting contract with a firm or individual
17 associated with financial activities, where such contract is entered into
18 for the purposes of (1) complying with state or federal law or
19 regulation, or (2) administering a federal program.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	<i>October 1, 2018, and applicable to contracts entered into or renewed on and after said date</i>	New section

Statement of Purpose:

To increase executive and legislative oversight of quasi-public agency contracts by requiring the submission of certain contracts to the Attorney General and relevant legislative committee.
