**"AN ACT CONCERNING THE REGIONAL PROCESSING AND
RETENTION OF FINGERPRINT RECORDS."**

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a task force
4 to (1) examine the state's system for fingerprinting and processing of
5 state and national criminal history records checks, conducted in
6 accordance with the provisions of section 29-17a of the general
7 statutes, for employees, applicants for employment, substitute teachers
8 and volunteers of local and regional boards of education, interdistrict
9 magnet school operators and regional educational service centers, and
10 (2) make recommendations for the improvement of such system.

11 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members:

12 (1) The Commissioner of Emergency Services and Public Protection,

13 or the commissioner's designee;

14 (2) The Commissioner of Education, or the commissioner's designee;
15 and

16 (3) One representative from each of the following associations,
17 designated by the association, (A) the Alliance of Regional Educational
18 Service Centers, (B) the Connecticut Association of Public School
19 Superintendents, (C) the Connecticut Association of Boards of
20 Education, (D) the Connecticut Association of Schools, (E) the
21 Connecticut Education Association, and (F) the American Federation
22 of Teachers-Connecticut.

23 (c) All appointments to the task force shall be made not later than
24 thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy shall be
25 filled by the designating association.

26 (d) The representative from the Alliance of Regional Educational
27 Service Centers shall serve as the chairperson of the task force. Such
28 chairpersons shall schedule the first meeting of the task force, which
29 shall be held not later than sixty days after the effective date of this
30 section.

31 (e) Not later than January 1, 2019, the task force shall submit a
32 report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing
33 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
34 relating to education and public safety and security, in accordance
35 with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes. The task
36 force shall terminate on the date that it submits such report or January
37 1, 2019, whichever is later."
