

Testimony Re: Senate Bill 103

I am currently in the hospital and receiving palliative care because I am dying from chronic lung disease. I asked my friend, Jasmine Wolf to send this testimony because I am unable to do so.

7 years ago, Prof. Theo Colborne released research on 363 fracking chemicals. Of the many chemicals that are harmful to the respiratory system, 97% are able to travel through the air and be inhaled, and 93% are water-soluble, and can be swallowed or absorbed through the skin. I have attached an infographic.

Accidents and leaks will expose police officers, firemen and workers wherever spills happen. People who have homes, have businesses or happen to be in an area where run-off or leaching into aquifers happens can have serious and lasting health problems.

Please pass Senate Bill 103 and permanently ban this toxic waste in CT.

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
