House Bill No. 5144

*House of Representatives, March 26, 2018*

The Committee on Aging reported through REP. SERRA of the 33rd Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

## ***AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF MEDICAID-FUNDED PROGRAMS.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) The Commissioner of Social  
2 Services shall conduct a study of Medicaid-funded state programs  
3 administered under Title XIX of the Social Security Act, as amended  
4 from time to time. Such study shall include, but need not be limited to,  
5 a report on: (1) Factors the commissioner deems pertinent to quality of  
6 care; (2) whether there are any gaps in access by eligible residents; and  
7 (3) whether any provisions of the programs need to be changed to  
8 conform with requirements of the Patient Protection and Affordable  
9 Care Act, P.L. 111-148, as amended from time to time.

10 (b) Not later than July 1, 2019, the commissioner shall report the  
11 results of the study, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a  
12 of the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General  
13 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to aging and human  
14 services. Such report may include the commissioner's

15 recommendations for addressing any identified gaps in the provision  
16 of Medicaid-funded state services and improving access to such  
17 services.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
