Senate Bill No. 369

*Senate, April 16, 2018*

The Committee on Appropriations reported through SEN. OSTEN of the 19th Dist. and SEN. FORMICA of the 20th Dist., Chairpersons of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

## **AN ACT CONCERNING JOB DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Commissioner of Economic  
2 and Community Development, in consultation with the Labor  
3 Commissioner, shall review job development and training programs in  
4 the state, and the means by which such programs are funded, to  
5 determine the adequacy and effectiveness of such programs and  
6 whether such programs are funded by the most cost-efficient,  
7 equitable and effective means. On or before October 1, 2018, the  
8 Commissioner of Economic and Community Development shall  
9 submit, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the  
10 general statutes, the results of the review to the joint standing  
11 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters  
12 relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies, commerce  
13 and labor. The results shall include recommendations for (1) additions  
14 or revisions to such programs, (2) revisions to funding for such

15 programs, and (3) any legislation necessary to implement such  
16 additions or revisions.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

The bill has no impact by requiring the Department of Economic and Community Development and the Department of Labor to review and make recommendations regarding job development and training programs by October 1, 2018. Both agencies annually review their respective budgets, which include funding for relevant programs on these topics, for the purposes of developing the Governor's proposed budget recommendations.

The bill requires the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development, in consultation with the Labor Commissioner, to review job development and training programs in the state, and the means by which such programs are funded, to determine the adequacy and effectiveness of such programs and whether such programs are funded by the most cost-efficient, equitable and effective means.

The Commissioners must submit results to the Appropriations, Labor, and Commerce committees and must include recommendations on the following:

1. additions or revisions to such programs,
2. revisions to funding for such programs, and
3. any legislation necessary to implement such additions or revisions.
