**"AN ACT ASSISTING STUDENTS WITHOUT LEGAL  
IMMIGRATION STATUS WITH THE COST OF COLLEGE."**

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and  
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Subsection (f) of section 10a-77 of the general statutes is  
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*  
5 *1, 2018*):

6 (f) Said board shall set aside from its anticipated regional  
7 community-technical college tuition revenue, an amount not less than  
8 that required by said board's tuition policy. Such funds shall be used to  
9 provide tuition waivers, tuition remissions, grants for educational  
10 expenses and student employment for residents enrolled in regional  
11 community-technical colleges as full or part-time matriculated  
12 students in a degree-granting program, or enrolled in a precollege  
13 remedial program, who demonstrate substantial financial need. Said  
14 board may also set aside from its anticipated tuition revenue an  
15 additional amount equal to one per cent of said tuition revenue for

16 financial assistance for students who would not otherwise be eligible  
17 for financial assistance but who do have a financial need as determined  
18 by the college in accordance with this subsection. In determining such  
19 financial need, the college shall exclude the value of equity in the  
20 principal residence of the student's parents or legal guardians, or in the  
21 student's principal residence if the student is not considered to be a  
22 dependent of his parents or legal guardians and shall assess the  
23 earnings of a dependent student at the rate of thirty per cent. Said  
24 board shall determine the eligibility of any student for the funds set  
25 aside pursuant to this subsection based on such student's eligibility for  
26 financial aid through completion of the Free Application for Federal  
27 Student Aid.

28 Sec. 502. Subsection (f) of section 10a-99 of the general statutes is  
29 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*  
30 *1, 2018*):

31 (f) Said board shall set aside from its anticipated tuition revenue, an  
32 amount not less than that required by the board of governors' tuition  
33 policy established under subdivision (3) of subsection (a) of section  
34 10a-6. Such funds shall be used to provide tuition waivers, tuition  
35 remissions, grants for educational expenses and student employment  
36 for any undergraduate or graduate student who is enrolled as a full or  
37 part-time matriculated student in a degree-granting program, or  
38 enrolled in a precollege remedial program, and who demonstrates  
39 substantial financial need. Said board may also set aside from its  
40 anticipated tuition revenue an additional amount equal to one per cent  
41 of said tuition revenue for financial assistance for students who would  
42 not otherwise be eligible for financial assistance but who do have a  
43 financial need as determined by the university in accordance with this  
44 subsection. In determining such financial need, the university shall  
45 exclude the value of equity in the principal residence of the student's  
46 parents or legal guardians, or in the student's principal residence if the  
47 student is not considered to be a dependent of his parents or legal  
48 guardians and shall assess the earnings of a dependent student at the  
49 rate of thirty per cent. Said board shall determine the eligibility of any

50 student for the funds set aside pursuant to this subsection based on  
51 such student's eligibility for financial aid through completion of the  
52 Free Application for Federal Student Aid.

53 Sec. 503. Subsection (g) of section 10a-105 of the general statutes is  
54 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*  
55 *1, 2018*):

56 (g) Said board of trustees shall set aside from its anticipated tuition  
57 revenue, an amount not less than that required by the board of  
58 governors' tuition policy established under subdivision (3) of  
59 subsection (a) of section 10a-6. Such funds shall be used to provide  
60 tuition waivers, tuition remissions, grants for educational expenses  
61 and student employment for any undergraduate, graduate or  
62 professional student who is enrolled as a full or part-time matriculated  
63 student in a degree-granting program, or enrolled in a precollege  
64 remedial program, and who demonstrates substantial financial need.  
65 Said board may also set aside from its anticipated tuition revenue an  
66 additional amount equal to one per cent of said tuition revenue for  
67 financial assistance for students who would not otherwise be eligible  
68 for financial assistance but who do have a financial need as determined  
69 by the university in accordance with this subsection. In determining  
70 such financial need, the university shall exclude the value of equity in  
71 the principal residence of the student's parents or legal guardians, or in  
72 the student's principal residence if the student is not considered to be a  
73 dependent of his parents or legal guardians and shall assess the  
74 earnings of a dependent student at the rate of thirty per cent. Said  
75 board shall determine the eligibility of any student for the funds set  
76 aside pursuant to this subsection based on such student's eligibility for  
77 financial aid through completion of the Free Application for Federal  
78 Student Aid."
