Proposed H.B. No. 5047 REP. REBIMBAS, 70th DIST. 'AN ACT INCREASING COPAYS UNDER STATE EMPLOYEE HEALTH CARE PLANS', to increase copays for all state employees by one per cent.

REF. APPROPRIATIONS

Proposed H.B. No. 5048 REP. REBIMBAS, 70th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A CAP ON STATE EDUCATIONAL REIMBURSEMENT FOR STATE EMPLOYEES', to cap educational reimbursements for state employees to an in-state university tuition level.

REF. APPROPRIATIONS

Proposed H.B. No. 5049 REP. CARPINO, 32nd DIST. 'AN ACT REDUCING THE SALARIES OF ALL ELECTED AND APPOINTED STATE OFFICIALS BY TEN PER CENT', to save money by reducing the salaries of state elected and appointed officials.

Proposed H.B. No. 5050 REP. CARPINO, 32nd DIST. 'AN ACT DECREASING LEGISLATIVE POSTAL COSTS', to decrease the amount of state funds used for legislators to send mail.

Proposed H.B. No. 5051 REP. WILMS, 142nd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPOSIT OF MOTOR VEHICLE SALES AND USE TAXES INTO THE SPECIAL TRANSPORTATION FUND', to accelerate the rate of deposit of motor vehicle sales and use taxes into the Special Transportation Fund and eliminate the phase-in.

Proposed H.B. No. 5052 REP. HARDING, 107th DIST. 'AN ACT INCREASING THE PERSONAL INCOME TAX DEDUCTION FOR INCOME RECEIVED FROM THE STATE TEACHERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM', to increase to fifty per cent, effective January 1, 2017, the personal income tax deduction for income received from the state teachers' retirement system.

Proposed H.B. No. 5055 REP. DELNICKI, 14th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS DEDUCTION FROM THE PERSONAL INCOME TAX', to increase the income limits for taxpayers to claim the deduction from the personal income tax for Social Security benefits.

Proposed H.B. No. 5060 REP. CARPINO, 32nd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING CITIZENS' ELECTION PROGRAM GRANTS', to (1) reduce by half the amounts of Citizens' Election Program grants, (2) prohibit consumer price index adjustments to such grants that increase such amounts and credit to the resources of the General Fund the amounts of such increases, and (3) prohibit payments of such grants to candidates unopposed in the general election campaign and credit to the General Fund the amounts of such prohibited payments.
