I am submitting this testimony in opposition to Raised HB 7101 AN ACT CONCERNING FLU SHOTS FOR SENIOR CITIZENS PRIOR TO HOSPITAL DISCHARGE.

The influenza vaccine has a notoriously low rate of effectiveness, year after year, and a high rate of reported adverse events. It is shameful that this inferior product would be offered to anyone let alone to patients being discharged from a hospital presumably after being treated for a serious medical condition—and, worse, to senior citizens who are easy targets for sales pitches.

Additionally, I see nothing in the bill about offering vaccine package inserts on the various flu vaccines available which would include lists of ingredients such as formaldehyde and octylphenol ethoxylate (a surfactant commonly used in paint), and adverse events such as Guillain-Barre Syndrome, Bell's Palsy and other nervous system disorders, and ironically even respiratory disorders.
