When we were searching for a larger home, we solely looked at homes in Canton because of the outstanding school system, the closeness of the students and parents and the exceptional teachers and school leadership.

It is important to us that our children are raised in a town that values community and connections. They will know these children and families in the classroom, on the baseball field, and in band concerts--and will have a strong sense of community and belonging.
