Substitute House Bill No. 6630

The Committee on Labor and Public Employees reported through REP. PORTER, R. of the 94th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT REQUIRING A STUDY REGARDING SOLAR ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR AND JOURNEYMAN LICENSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) The Commissioner of Consumer
2 Protection, after consulting with the Labor Commissioner, shall study
3 existing solar electrical contractor and journeyman licenses and any
4 associated regulations adopted pursuant to title 20 of the general
5 statutes, regarding the installation of commercial and residential solar
6 electrical systems.

7 (b) Not later than January 1, 2020, the Commissioner of Consumer
8 Protection shall report, in accordance with section 11-4a of the general
9 statutes, the results and any findings of the study completed pursuant
10 to subsection (a) of this section to the joint standing committees of the
11 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to consumer
12 protection and labor.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
