The Committee on Judiciary reported through SEN. WINFIELD of the 10th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF CRIMINAL LAWS OF THIS STATE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) There is established a working
2 group to study the criminal laws of this state. Such study shall include,
3 at a minimum, a review of titles 53 and 53a of the general statutes for
4 the purpose of recommending legislative changes. The working group
5 shall consist of the following members who have expertise in criminal
6 laws: (1) One appointed by the speaker of the House of
7 Representatives; (2) one appointed by the president pro tempore of the
8 Senate; (3) one appointed by the majority leader of the House of
9 Representatives; (4) one appointed by the majority leader of the Senate;
10 (5) one appointed by the minority leader of the House of
11 Representatives; and (6) one appointed by the minority leader of the
12 Senate. Not later than January 1, 2020, the working group shall submit
13 a report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing
14 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters

15 relating to the judiciary, in accordance with the provisions of section
16 11-4a of the general statutes. The working group shall terminate on the
17 date that it submits such report or January 1, 2020, whichever is later.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
