**REASONS FOR BILL:**

HB-6120 seeks to allow certain persons to file for property tax exemptions, notwithstanding certain statutory deadlines. It also seeks to allow the town of Woodbridge to renew certain temporary notes. According to testimony, this bill is needed in order to aid certain organizations that are typically funded through donations and/or state or local grants to be exempt from paying specific taxes to state or local government. This bill would aid these organizations by increasing the amount of time in which they may file their application.

**NATURE AND SOURCES OF SUPPORT:**

**Rep. Juan Candelaria | 95<sup>th</sup> Dist.** stated his support for the bill. He explains that through this bill, any person in the city of New Haven eligible for a certain 2017 Grand List Exemption that has missed the filing deadline would be permitted to file such application within a specified time period. He further states that the purpose of this bill would be to allow organizations with

Grand List Exemptions (i.e. educational or charitable organizations) to submit such application after the typical allotted time.
