

“Hi, my name is Ingrid Rodriguez and I am a constituent calling to ask Representative Rosa DeLauro to OPPOSE H.B. 1638.

I oppose any legislation that would eliminate personal belief exemption to MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccines.

MMR vaccines carry a high rate of side effects, and it is unethical to require parents to have their children vaccinated with MMR vaccines to attend daycare or school.

MMR vaccines contain live viruses; therefore the vaccines can cause measles. Additionally, more than 157 papers demonstrate vaccine-autism causation.

MMR vaccines (as well as flu shots and other vaccines) contain adjuvants such as aluminum that are clear toxins. Vaccines also contain fetal human and animal cells. We want neither in our blood stream and organs.

My youngest daughter had a small seizure after her last MMR vaccine. I was told by my pediatrician that this was normal. I am grateful that she suffered no other harmful effects.

My liver was damaged through several strongly recommended flu shots during my pregnancy. This was eight years ago and I'm still not fully recovered.

This is not acceptable. We cannot continue putting people at risk. Every BODY will respond differently to different medical interventions. Mandating medical interventions ignores this reality and removes consent.

Personal belief exemptions are available for *all* other required vaccines in Washington.

I strongly urge Representative DeLauro to oppose this bill.
