#### ***Explanation***

The amendment expands the authority of the Office of the Attorney General (AG) by specifically allowing the agency to: (1) investigate allegations of hate crimes and civil rights violations; (2) initiate legal proceedings in the state's name.

This could result in a revenue gain to the state anticipated to be at least \$100,000 annually. The amount of any revenue gain depends on the number of new hate crimes and civil rights violations brought to court under the AG's newly specified authority.<sup>1</sup> Any revenue gain also depends on the amount of monetary damages awarded when the state prevails when these cases are brought to civil court.
