1 Strike subsection (b) of section 1 in its entirety and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "(b) The council shall consist of the following members: (1) The
4 House chairperson of the joint standing committee of the General
5 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor and public
6 employees; (2) the Senate chairperson of the joint standing committee
7 of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor
8 and public employees; (3) the House and Senate ranking members or
9 their designees; (4) the undersecretary of the Office of Policy and
10 Management Criminal Justice Policy and Planning Division, or the
11 undersecretary's designee; (5) the Commissioner of Correction, or the
12 commissioner's designee; (6) The Labor Commissioner, or the
13 commissioner's designee; (7) the Commissioner of Consumer
14 Protection, or the commissioner's designee; (8) the executive director of

15 the Connecticut Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities, or
16 the executive director's designee; (9) the executive director of the
17 Commission on Equity and Opportunity, or the executive director's
18 designee; (10) a justice-impacted person, to be appointed by the House
19 chairperson of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
20 having cognizance of matters relating to labor and public employees;
21 (11) a representative from the American Civil Liberties Union of
22 Connecticut, to be appointed by the Senate chairperson of the joint
23 standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of
24 matters relating to labor and public employees; (12) a representative
25 from the Connecticut Coalition for Achievement Now, to be appointed
26 by the House chairperson of the joint standing committee of the
27 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor and
28 public employees; (13) a representative from the Connecticut Coalition
29 to End Homelessness, to be appointed by the Senate chairperson of the
30 joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance
31 of matters relating to labor and public employees; (14) a representative
32 from the Institute for Municipal and Regional Policy, to be appointed
33 by the House chairperson of the joint standing committee of the
34 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor and
35 public employees; (15) a representative from the Katal Center for
36 Health, Equity, and Justice, to be appointed by the Senate chairperson
37 of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
38 cognizance of matters relating to labor and public employees; (16) a
39 representative from the National Council for Incarcerated and
40 Formerly Incarcerated Women and Girls, to be appointed by the
41 House chairperson of the joint standing committee of the General
42 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor and public
43 employees; (17) a representative from the New Haven Legal Assistance
44 Association Reentry Clinic, to be appointed by the Senate chairperson
45 of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
46 cognizance of matters relating to labor and public employees; (18) a
47 representative from the Service Employees' International Union, Local
48 32BJ, to be appointed by the House chairperson of the joint standing
49 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters

50 relating to labor and public employees; and (19) a representative from
51 Voices of Women of Color, to be appointed by the Senate chairperson
52 of the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having
53 cognizance of matters relating to labor and public employees."
