HB. No. 5087 (COMM) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT EXEMPTING VETERANS FROM THE PASSPORT TO THE PARKS MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION FEE', to exempt veterans from payment of the Passport to the Parks fee.

REF. VETERANS' AFFAIRS

HB. No. 5200 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING NURSING HOME SERVICES', to study the sufficiency of nursing home services in the state.

REF. AGING

HB. No. 5203 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PROPERTY TAX DEFERRAL FOR ELDERLY PERSONS', to help alleviate financial burdens on elderly homeowners by permitting municipalities to defer property taxes for those who qualify for such tax deferrals.

HB. No. 5204 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING TRANSPORTATION FOR NONAMBULATORY NURSING HOME RESIDENTS', to increase the opportunity for nonambulatory residents of nursing homes to visit the homes of family members.

HB. No. 5205 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF MEDICAID-FUNDED PROGRAMS', to study the efficacy of Medicaid-funded programs in serving senior citizens and others.

HB. No. 5206 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE RENTERS' REBATE PROGRAM FOR SENIOR CITIZENS AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES', to remove impediments to timely financial relief for senior citizens and persons with disabilities.

HB. No. 5207 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT EXEMPTING SENIOR CITIZENS FROM THE "PASSPORT TO THE PARKS FEE"', to exempt senior citizens age sixty-five and older from the "Passport to the Parks Fee".

HB. No. 5208 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT DETERRING ABUSE IN NURSING HOMES', to allow nursing home residents or their representatives to install electronic monitoring devices in their rooms, provided any roommates agree in writing to the use of such devices and liability for any breach of privacy related to the resident's use of such device is waived for nursing homes.

HB. No. 5209 (RAISED) AGING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF THE UNIFORM REAL PROPERTY TRANSFER ON DEATH ACT', to allow senior citizens and others to transfer real property at death to avert costly, time-consuming probate proceedings.

HB. No. 5210 (RAISED) COMMERCE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING NONCOMPETE AGREEMENTS IN THE BLOCKCHAIN TECHNOLOGY INDUSTRY', to prohibit the use of noncompete agreements in the blockchain technology industry.

HB. No. 5211 (RAISED) COMMERCE. 'AN ACT IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WORKING GROUP ON A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP TO RECRUIT BUSINESSES TO CONNECTICUT', to implement the recommendations of the working group on a public-private partnership to recruit businesses to the state.

HB. No. 5212 (RAISED) COMMERCE. 'AN ACT EXTENDING THE MANUFACTURING APPRENTICESHIP TAX CREDIT TO PASS-THROUGH ENTITIES', to allow certain business entities to claim the manufacturing apprenticeship tax credit against the personal income tax.

HB. No. 5213 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A PILOT PROGRAM FOR AN EARLY CHILDHOOD BUSINESS INCUBATOR MODEL', to establish a pilot program that authorizes the Commissioner of Early Childhood to issue a license to a person or group of persons to operate a family child care home in a space that is not a private home and that has been provided by an association, organization, corporation, institution or agency.

HB. No. 5214 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF SPECIAL EDUCATION AT TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND CAREER SCHOOLS', to repeal the provision permitting the referral of a special education student enrolled in a technical education and career school to the school district in which such student resides.

HB. No. 5215 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE INCLUSION OF CLIMATE CHANGE INSTRUCTION IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CURRICULUM', to include climate change instruction in the public school curriculum of the state.

HB. No. 5216 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT ELIMINATING THE LICENSURE EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING CHILD CARE SERVICES', to remove the licensure exemption for certain organizations that provide child care services.

HB. No. 5217 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A WORKING GROUP TO STUDY ISSUES RELATING TO SCHOOL START TIMES', to require the Department of Education to establish a working group to study issues relating to school start times.

HB. No. 5218 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE OFFICE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD', to implement the recommendations of the Office of Early Childhood.

HB. No. 5219 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING YOUTH CAMPS', to require licensed youth camp employees who are eighteen years of age or older to submit to a comprehensive background check.

HB. No. 5220 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT EXPANDING ELIGIBILITY IN THE CARE4KIDS PROGRAM TO PARENTS PARTICIPATING IN AN EVEN START PROGRAM OR ENROLLED IN CERTAIN SECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS', to expand eligibility in the Care4Kids program to parents who are participating in a local Even Start program or enrolled in certain secondary education programs.

HB. No. 5221 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PUBLIC EDUCATION IN CONNECTICUT', to require the Department of Education to conduct a study of public education in Connecticut.
REF. EDUCATION

HB. No. 5222 (RAISED) EDUCATION. 'AN ACT EXPANDING ELIGIBILITY IN THE CARE4KIDS PROGRAM FOR HOMELESS FAMILIES', to expand eligibility in the Care4Kids program to include homeless families.

HB. No. 5223 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING VOLTAGE STANDARDS', to require electric distribution companies to comply with the most current voltage variation standards of the American National Standards Institute when rendering service to commercial or residential properties, unless otherwise granted an exemption.

HB. No. 5224 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT REQUIRING THE STUDY OF THE USE OF TECHNOLOGY IN THE STATE', to require the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection to conduct a study to determine whether policy and procedural changes within the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection may increase the effectiveness of the use of technology in the state.

HB. No. 5225 (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING CONSUMER PROTECTIONS FOR CUSTOMERS OF ELECTRIC SUPPLIERS', to (1) define "telesales call", "record" and "recording", (2) add requirements for electric suppliers regarding telesales calls and face-to-face marketing, to (3) permit the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority to order fines, restitution to customers or a combination of fines and restitution, and (4) prohibit the assignment or transfer of customers without prior approval of the authority.

[HB. No. 5226](#) (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS', to (1) make void and unenforceable any covenant, restriction or condition in any deed, contract, security instrument or other instrument affecting the transfer or sale of property which prohibits or unreasonably restricts the installation or use of an electric vehicle charging station, (2) establish conditions to which a unit owner must agree in order to obtain approval for installation of an electric vehicle charging station, and (3) permit tenants to request installation of electric vehicle charging stations, subject to compliance with a landlord's requirements.

[HB. No. 5227](#) (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING DISTRIBUTED ENERGY RESOURCES SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS', to authorize the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority to perform joint or concurrent evaluations of grid-side system enhancement proposals, and to provide the department authority to procure renewable natural gas from anaerobic digestion facilities for injection into the natural gas distribution system.

[HB. No. 5228](#) (RAISED) ENERGY AND TECHNOLOGY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE COMMERCIAL PROPERTY ASSESSED CLEAN ENERGY PROGRAM', to expand the definition of energy improvements to include zero-emission vehicle refueling infrastructure and resiliency measures and to exempt these expansions from the savings-to-investments ratio and to permit direct assignment of liens to third-party capital providers.

Proposed [HB. No. 5229](#) REP. WOOD, 29th DIST. 'AN ACT ELIMINATING THE QUALIFYING INCOME THRESHOLDS FOR THE SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS DEDUCTION UNDER THE PERSONAL INCOME TAX', to eliminate the qualifying income thresholds for the Social Security benefits deduction under the personal income tax.

Proposed [HB. No. 5231](#) REP. WOOD, 29th DIST. 'AN ACT EXCLUDING COIN-OPERATED CAR WASHES FROM THE SALES TAX', to exclude coin-operated car washes from the sales tax.

HB. No. 5232 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A MINIMUM BASE RATE FOR METHADONE MAINTENANCE TREATMENT', to eliminate requirements that payment rates be tied to performance measures.

HB. No. 5233 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PAYMENTS TO PROVIDERS OF SOCIAL SERVICES', to ensure adequate payment to providers of social services to ensure access to quality care and integrate peer support services for behavioral health into the Medicaid program.

HB. No. 5234 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER ADVISORY COUNCIL', to add persons with autism spectrum disorder or their parents as chairpersons of the Autism Spectrum Disorder Advisory Council.

REF. HUMAN SERVICES

HB. No. 5235 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING NURSING FACILITY REIMBURSEMENT', to implement an acuity-based payment reimbursement system under the medical assistance program for nursing facilities.

REF. HUMAN SERVICES

HB. No. 5236 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE TRANSITION TO A MEDICAID NURSING HOME FACILITY CASE MIX PAYMENT SYSTEM', to ensure the transition to a new Medicaid payment system for nursing home facilities is equitable, efficient and adequately funded.

HB. No. 5237 (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING', to make a technical change to a provision concerning the Department of Housing.

REF. HOUSING

HB. No. 5238 (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT FOR FIRST-TIME HOMEOWNERS WHO OBTAIN A LOAN FROM THE CONNECTICUT HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY', to authorize municipalities to abate up to five hundred dollars per assessment year of property taxes for certain first-time homebuyers obtaining a loan from the Connecticut Housing Finance Authority.

[HB. No. 5239](#) (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TAXES FOR STATE HOUSING AUTHORITY PROPERTIES', to provide municipalities with payment in lieu of taxes for state housing authority properties.

REF. HOUSING

[HB. No. 5240](#) (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING', to require new construction of affordable housing developments to comply with additional accessibility, lighting and renewable energy requirements.

[HB. No. 5241](#) (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY FOR RENTAL PROPERTIES', to improve enforcement of code requirements in rental properties by restoring the prohibition on rent collection without a certificate of occupancy.

[HB. No. 5242](#) (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE RISK OF HOMELESSNESS FOR THOSE RELEASED FROM THE CUSTODY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION', to require the Department of Correction to assess the risk of homelessness for incarcerated persons released from its custody and to create a program to address such homelessness and to require additional reports to measure the extent of such homelessness.

[HB. No. 5243](#) (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING BONDS OF BOARD MEMBERS AND OTHER EMPLOYEES OF THE CONNECTICUT HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY', to permit the board members and other employees of the Connecticut Housing Finance Authority to obtain an equivalent insurance product in lieu of a surety bond.

[HB. No. 5244](#) (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ADDITIONAL HOUSING PROTECTIONS FOR A VICTIM OF FAMILY VIOLENCE OR SEXUAL ASSAULT', to allow a person who has a valid order of protection to request that such person's landlord change the locks to the person's dwelling unit.

[HB. No. 5245](#) (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT INCREASING THE PERMISSIBLE AMOUNT OF SECURITY DEPOSIT A LANDLORD MAY CHARGE', to permit a landlord to require a tenant pay a security deposit of up to three months' rent.

HB. No. 5246 (RAISED) HOUSING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF FAIR SHARE HOUSING', to require the Commissioner of Housing to study the New Jersey Fair Housing Act to determine the feasibility of implementing provisions of said act in the state.

HB. No. 5247 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING EXPLANATIONS OF BENEFITS', to require health insurers that deliver, issue for delivery, renew, amend or continue certain health insurance policies in this state to issue explanations of benefits to consumers in certain circumstances, disclose information concerning explanations of benefits to consumers, and require that explanations of benefits be maintained as confidential in certain circumstances.

HB. No. 5248 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR PEER SUPPORT SERVICES IN THIS STATE', to establish a task force to study health insurance coverage for peer support services in this state.

HB. No. 5249 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING DENTAL INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR CHILDREN, STEPCHILDREN AND OTHER DEPENDENT CHILDREN', to allow children, stepchildren and other dependent children to retain dental insurance coverage under their parents' insurance policies until they attain the age of twenty-six or obtain substitute coverage through an employer.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

HB. No. 5250 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING REQUIREMENTS FOR PRESCRIBING CLINICALLY INAPPROPRIATE QUANTITIES OF OUTPATIENT PSYCHOTROPIC DRUGS', to prohibit health insurance policies providing coverage for outpatient prescription drugs, and mental health care benefits provided under state law, with state funds or to state employees, from requiring a prescribing health care provider to prescribe an outpatient psychotropic drug in a quantity that such provider deems clinically inappropriate.

HB. No. 5251 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS IN THIS STATE', to establish a task force to study health insurance coverage for undocumented immigrants in this state.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

HB. No. 5252 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING CERTAIN VEHICLE STORAGE AGREEMENTS AS A PRECONDITION TO VEHICLE TOWING', to prohibit a wrecker from requiring a vehicle owner to contract for more than twenty-four hours of vehicle storage as a precondition to towing the owner's vehicle.

HB. No. 5253 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING DENTAL AND VISION INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR CHILDREN, STEPCHILDREN AND OTHER DEPENDENT CHILDREN', to allow children, stepchildren and other dependent children to retain dental and vision insurance coverage under their parents' insurance policies until they attain the age of twenty-six or obtain substitute coverage through an employer.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

HB. No. 5254 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT REQUIRING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT FOR OPIOID USE DISORDER', to require health insurance coverage for medication-assisted treatment for opioid use disorder.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

HB. No. 5255 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING LIVING ORGAN DONOR INSURANCE DISCRIMINATION', to (1) prohibit certain insurers from discriminating against any individual solely because such individual is a living organ donor, and (2) provide that such discrimination constitutes a violation of the Connecticut Unfair Insurance Practices Act.

HB. No. 5256 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING REQUIRED HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR DETOXIFICATION AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES', to modify required health insurance coverage for detoxification and substance abuse services.

REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

HB. No. 5257 (RAISED) INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE. 'AN ACT REQUIRING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR PRESCRIPTION EYEGLASSES FOR COVERED DEPENDENT CHILDREN WHO ARE YOUNGER THAN NINETEEN YEARS OF AGE', to require health insurance coverage for (1) at least one pair of prescription eyeglasses during each policy year for each covered dependent child who is younger than nineteen years of age, and (2) not more than one additional pair of prescription eyeglasses for such child during such policy year if the pair of covered prescription eyeglasses that such child previously received during such policy year is lost during such policy year.

HB. No. 5258 (RAISED) JUDICIARY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE UNIFORM COMMERCIAL REAL ESTATE RECEIVERSHIP ACT', to adopt the Uniform Commercial Real Estate Receivership Act.

HB. No. 5259 (RAISED) TRANSPORTATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PEDESTRIAN SAFETY AT CROSSWALKS, SPEED LIMITS IN MUNICIPALITIES, FINES AND CHARGES FOR CERTAIN VIOLATIONS AND THE GREENWAYS COMMEMORATIVE ACCOUNT', to (1) require motorists to grant the right-of-way to pedestrians who affirmatively indicate their intention to cross the road in a crosswalk; (2) allow local traffic authorities to establish lower speed limits on streets under their jurisdiction by holding a public hearing regarding such speed limits and providing notification of such speed limits to the Office of the State Traffic Administration; (3) increase the fine for operating a motor vehicle while using a hand-held mobile telephone or electronic device; (4) increase the additional fee provided to municipalities for certain traffic violations; and (5) establish the greenways commemorative account.

REF. TRANSPORTATION

HB. No. 5260 (RAISED) TRANSPORTATION. 'AN ACT CONCERNING DEALERSHIP FRANCHISES', to create a task force to recommend legislation concerning agreements between motor vehicle manufacturers or distributors and motor vehicle dealers.

REF. TRANSPORTATION

HB. No. 5261 (RAISED) TRANSPORTATION. 'AN ACT REQUIRING ENGINEERS AT THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INSPECT CERTAIN CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS', to require engineers employed by the Department of Transportation on a full-time basis to inspect highway and bridge construction projects.

[HB. No. 5262](#) (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING SPECIAL REGISTRATION MARKER PLATES FOR VETERANS WHO SERVED IN PERIODS OF WAR', to create special registration marker plates available to veterans who served during certain periods of war.

[HB. No. 5263](#) (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SERVICE RIBBON FOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES PROVIDING HONOR GUARD DETAIL', to authorize the Adjutant General to issue a service ribbon to each member of the armed forces providing honor guard detail at funerals of veterans.

[HB. No. 5264](#) (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ANNUAL REPORT OF BENEFITS TO VETERANS', to extend the deadline for the Commissioner of Veterans Affairs to compile data and submit the report of benefits to veterans to the Military Department and the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to military and veterans' affairs.

[HB. No. 5265](#) (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ORGANIZATION OF THE CONNECTICUT STATE GUARD', to allow the Governor to raise, organize, maintain and govern the Connecticut State Guard.

[HB. No. 5266](#) (RAISED) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A GREEN ALERT SYSTEM FOR MISSING VETERANS', to establish a Green Alert system for missing veterans.
