AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSUMER PROTECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective January 1, 2022*) The Commissioner of
- 2 Consumer Protection shall adopt regulations, in accordance with the
- 3 provisions of chapter 54 of the general statutes, regarding the efficient
- 4 organization of the Department of Consumer Protection.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
