Substitute House Bill No. 6460

House of Representatives, March 25, 2021

The Committee on General Law reported through REP. D'AGOSTINO of the 91st Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT REQUIRING A STUDY OF THE IMPACT OF EXTENDING ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR SERVICE HOURS AT GAMING AND OTHER ESTABLISHMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) The Liquor Control Commission
2 shall study the potential impact of extending alcoholic liquor service
3 hours at gaming and other establishments regulated pursuant to title 30
4 of the general statutes and located not more than fifty miles from any
5 border of this state.

6 (b) Not later than January 1, 2022, the Liquor Control Commission
7 shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general
8 statutes, report its findings pursuant to the study required by subsection
9 (a) of this section to the joint standing committee of the General
10 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to general law.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
