# AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON SENIOR CITIZENS AND ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (Effective from passage) (a) The Commissioners of Public
- 2 Health, Aging and Disability Services and Social Services shall study the
- 3 impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the health, safety and welfare of
- 4 senior citizens, including, but not limited to, residents of nursing home
- facilities, as defined in section 19a-490 of the general statutes, and
- 6 managed residential communities, as defined in section 19a-693 of the
- 7 general statutes, and adults with disabilities.
- 8 (b) Not later than January 1, 2022, the commissioners shall file a
- 9 report in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general
- 10 statutes to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly
- 11 having cognizance of matters relating to aging, human services and
- 12 public health. The report shall include (1) the impact of the COVID-19
- 13 pandemic on the health, safety and welfare of senior citizens and adults
- 14 with disabilities, and (2) recommendations to mitigate the impact of any

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
