I am part of the Access CT health care system. I am self-employed. I am a single mother with two children and own an appraisal business. I am horrified at the state of our insurance industry especially the health industry. This has fallen to an all-time low. I have watched it deteriorate in the past five years. I think the Governor and our elected officials need to be on the side of the legal citizen versus the large insurance companies. The state of our country with Donald Trump and Bernie Sanders is a result of years of mediocre leadership that has done nothing to provide healthcare to an individual and a small business. Everyone sitting in the chairs in Hartford needs to wake up and start reforming the health insurance industry. Many of you have a great policy. Well I don't! It is certainly not because I don't pay through the teeth for one. I work until June 1st to pay for insurance (medical, homeowners, E and O, Disability, auto) and then property and state taxes. Starting June 1st then my income goes to survival – roof over the head of myself, my eight-year-old daughter and my 12 year old son. It goes to pay electricity, gas, food, clothing and school activities. There is not much left if any.
