Connecticut's 169 towns and cities successfully use local zoning and planning processes to balance private property rights, the community's interests, demands on infrastructure, housing needs and economic growth.

I do not support Bills H.B. 6107, H.B. 6611, H.B. 6612, H.B. 6613, S.B. 1024, S.B. 1026 and S.B. 1027. Zoning and all of the accompanying local decision making, public input, public hearings and other relevant information should be left to the Towns and their stakeholders. Towns in CT all have their own characteristics which is what makes them appealing to different types of people. Also, land is finite and unique, and what you do with it has implications and long-term consequences. State control should NEVER be allowed! Zoning is not a one-size-fits-all issue! Local control and local input enable neighbors and the local community to provide beneficial suggestions, to identify errors and maximize community buy-in on zoning proposals.
