Potential Cost

The amendment strikes the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact.

There is a potential cost to the state employee and retiree health plan, the Partnership Plan, and fully-insured municipalities resulting from the amendment, which requires that health care providers give consultations to patients related to the administration of vaccines. To the extent that providing such consultations results in additional claims submitted by providers to insurers, there is a cost that will be reflected in premiums for plan years starting on or after January 1, 2022.

Pursuant to federal law, self-insured plans are exempt from state coverage mandates. However, state plans have traditionally adopted such mandates.
