AGING

Proposed H.B. No. 5206 REP. COOK, 65th DIST. 'AN ACT PERMITTING THE USE OF VIDEO MONITORING DEVICES AT SKILLED NURSING AND ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES', to ensure the safety of residents of skilled nursing and assisted living facilities by permitting the use of video monitoring devices.

Proposed H.B. No. 5207 REP. VARGAS, 6th DIST. 'AN ACT PROTECTING PROPERTY OWNERS AGE FIFTY AND OLDER FROM FORECLOSURE', to prevent foreclosure for certain delinquent taxpayers age fifty or older.

APPROPRIATIONS

Proposed H.B. No. 5208 REP. ZAWISTOWSKI, 61st DIST. 'AN ACT REIMBURSING TOWNS FOR THE COSTS OF THE AIRPORT DEVELOPMENT ZONE SURROUNDING BRADLEY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT', to restore funding for the airport development zone surrounding Bradley International Airport.

Proposed H.B. No. 5209 REP. WILSON, 66th DIST. 'AN ACT EXCLUDING OVERTIME PAY AND LEGISLATIVE MILEAGE ALLOWANCES FROM THE CALCULATION OF STATE PENSIONS', to exclude overtime pay and legislative mileage allowances from the calculation of state pensions.

Proposed H.B. No. 5210 REP. COOK, 65th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING FUNDING FOR THE WARNER THEATRE', to provide similar funding to the Warner Theatre in Torrington as is provided to other performing arts centers in Connecticut that are similar in scope and size.

Proposed H.B. No. 5211 REP. HALL, 59th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF FUNDS FROM THE DRUG ASSETS FORFEITURE REVOLVING ACCOUNT FOR DRUG TREATMENT BEDS', to increase drug treatment options in the state.

Proposed H.B. No. 5212 REP. HALL, 59th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE DATE OF ADOPTION FOR PORTIONS OF THE STATE BUDGET APPROPRIATING AID TO MUNICIPALITIES', to provide predictability to municipalities when determining their budget.

Proposed H.B. No. 5213 REP. TURCO, 27th DIST. 'AN ACT FUNDING THE DEBT-FREE COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROGRAM', to fully fund the debt-free community college program.

BANKING

Proposed H.B. No. 5214 REP. RUTIGLIANO, 123rd DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING MORTGAGE LENDERS AND MORTGAGE SERVICERS TO ACCEPT AND APPLY PARTIAL MORTGAGE PAYMENTS', to prevent mortgage lenders and mortgage servicers from refusing to accept and apply partial mortgage payments.

COMMERCE

Proposed H.B. No. 5215 REP. LUXENBERG, 12th DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A GRANT PROGRAM FOR CERTAIN RESEARCHERS ENGAGED IN STEM-RELATED RESEARCH IN THE STATE', to encourage technology start-ups to establish their businesses in Connecticut and grow technology sector jobs for state residents.

Proposed H.B. No. 5216 REP. HAINES, 34th DIST. 'AN ACT EXTENDING THE MANUFACTURING APPRENTICESHIP TAX CREDIT TO PASS-THROUGH ENTITIES', to extend the manufacturing apprenticeship tax credit to pass-through entities.

Proposed H.B. No. 5217 REP. MUSHINSKY, 85th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ADVANCED MANUFACTURING WORKFORCE NEEDS', to address the shortage of advanced manufacturing workers in Connecticut.

Proposed H.B. No. 5218 REP. MUSHINSKY, 85th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ADVANCED MANUFACTURING WORKFORCE TRAINING AT GATEWAY COMMUNITY COLLEGE', to establish a workforce training program for advanced manufacturing at Gateway Community College.

Proposed H.B. No. 5219 REP. LANOUE, 45th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF LICENSED YOUTH CAMPS', to require employees of licensed youth camps who are eighteen years of age or older to submit to comprehensive background checks.

EDUCATION

Proposed H.B. No. 5220 REP. HOWARD, 43rd DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY STATE STANDARDIZED TESTING OF STUDENTS', to establish a task force to evaluate all aspects and impacts of state-mandated standardized testing on students, and provide recommendations on ways to improve implementation and methods of measuring student achievement.

Proposed H.B. No. 5221 REP. HOWARD, 43rd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING REVISIONS TO THE CONNECTICUT GUIDELINES FOR EDUCATOR EVALUATION', to allow educators who are rated as exemplary or proficient to continue to use their teaching hours focused on classroom instruction and student development by not requiring annual evaluations for such high-achieving educators, and providing educators with continuing support who have not yet reached exemplary and proficient evaluation ratings.

Proposed H.B. No. 5222 REP. CARPINO, 32nd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO MAKING CERTAIN CHANGES TO A SCHOOL DISTRICT'S LEARNING MODEL', to require an open public comment period and a vote by the local or regional board of education prior to making certain changes to the school district's learning model.

'AN ACT PROHIBITING SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICIES THAT DISCRIMINATE AGAINST STUDENTS BASED ON NATURAL HAIR AND HAIRSTYLES', to prohibit local and regional boards of education from adopting policies that discriminate against students based on natural hair and hairstyles.

Proposed H.B. No. 5231 REP. MCCARTY, 38th DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY ISSUES RELATING TO SPECIAL EDUCATION', to establish a task force to study issues relating to special education in order to assist boards of education in providing a more personalized set of services to students who require special education.

Proposed H.B. No. 5232 REP. MCCARTY, 38th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE CREATION OF INITIATIVES AND INCENTIVES FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT PARTNERSHIPS', to create initiatives and incentives for boards of education that voluntarily choose to engage in partnerships for the provision of learning and services to students.

Proposed H.B. No. 5233 REP. MCCARTY, 38th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE CREATION OF INCENTIVES FOR MINORITY TEACHER CERTIFICATION AND RETENTION', to create incentives to increase minority teacher certification and retention in rural and suburban school districts throughout the state.

Proposed H.B. No. 5234 REP. PETIT, 22nd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING SUICIDE PREVENTION IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS', to assist school districts in developing and implementing suicide prevention protocols.

'AN ACT CONCERNING INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDERS AND NET NEUTRALITY PRINCIPLES', to require Internet service providers to register and pay registration fees and to require the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority to apply net neutrality principles to Internet service providers and enforce such principles with civil penalties.

Proposed H.B. No. 5252 REP. GIBSON, 15th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING INDECENT DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES, THE REGULATION OF INTERNET-ENABLED DEVICES, LIVE ADULT ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENTS, SOCIAL MEDIA CENSORSHIP AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CONNECTICUT HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND CHILD EXPLOITATION PREVENTION GRANT FUND', to prohibit indecent deceptive trade practices, regulate Internet-enabled devices, live adult entertainment establishments and social media censorship and establish the Connecticut Human Trafficking and Child Exploitation Prevention grant fund.

Proposed H.B. No. 5253 REP. DELNICKI, 14th DIST.; REP. PAVALOCK-D'AMATO, 77th DIST.; REP. CARNEY, 23rd DIST. 'AN ACT PREVENTING DELIVERY RATE INCREASES AND DIRECTING A STUDY ON INCREASED COMPETITION IN THE ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION MARKET', to prevent delivery rate increases until May 1, 2022, and to study whether increased competition in the electric distribution market would benefit the public.

Proposed H.B. No. 5254 REP. HORN, 64th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING THE PUBLIC UTILITIES REGULATORY AUTHORITY TO AMEND THE PROCESS OF ATTACHING EQUIPMENT TO PUBLIC UTILITY POLES', to require the Public Utilities Regulatory Authority to initiate a docket and adopt regulations to amend the process for attaching equipment to public utility poles.

Proposed H.B. No. 5255 REP. TURCO, 27th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING ELECTRONIC DEVICE MANUFACTURERS TO MAKE AVAILABLE ESSENTIAL COMPONENTS OF ITS ELECTRONIC DEVICES TO OWNERS AND INDEPENDENT REPAIR SERVICE PROVIDERS', to require electronic device manufacturers to make available, on reasonable terms, the documentation, parts and tools needed to diagnose, maintain and repair said manufacturers' electronic devices.

Proposed H.B. No. 5256 REP. ROSARIO, 128th DIST.; REP. GRESKO, 121st DIST. 'AN ACT CREATING A MUNICIPAL ENERGY SECURITY AUTHORITY', to create a municipal energy security authority within the state.

Proposed H.B. No. 5257 REP. HALL, 59th DIST. 'AN ACT ELIMINATING THE VIRTUAL NET METERING CAP', to eliminate the virtual net metering cap.

Proposed H.B. No. 5258 REP. LUXENBERG, 12th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ACCESS TO SOLAR POWER ENERGY INCENTIVES FOR NONOWNER-OCCUPIED RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES', to authorize access to solar power energy incentives for nonowner-occupied residential properties.

Proposed H.B. No. 5259 REP. COOK, 65th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE REGULATION OF CABLE TELEVISION RATES', to regulate cable television rates.

Proposed H.B. No. 5260 REP. HADDAD, 54th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING COMMUNITY CHOICE AGGREGATION', to allow community choice aggregation.

ENVIRONMENT

Proposed H.B. No. 5261 REP. TURCO, 27th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PUBLIC NOTICE OF THE APPLICATION OF PESTICIDES', to require transparency in the type of chemicals used when pesticides are applied and to enhance notification of such application to the public.

Proposed H.B. No. 5262 REP. CONLEY, 40th DIST.; SEN. OSTEN, 19th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF PFAS IN FIREFIGHTING FOAM', to prohibit the use of PFAS in firefighting foams and develop a take-back program for such products.

Proposed H.B. No. 5263 REP. HALL, 59th DIST. 'AN ACT EXEMPTING SENIOR CITIZENS FROM THE "PASSPORT TO THE PARKS FEE" WHEN REGISTERING A MOTOR VEHICLE', to exempt a senior citizen from the "Passport to the Parks Fee" when registering a motor vehicle.

Proposed H.B. No. 5264 REP. CARNEY, 23rd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PERMITTING FOR MARINE DREDGING PROJECTS', to provide for a less extensive dredging permit process for maintenance dredging.

FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING

Proposed H.B. No. 5265 REP. CHEESEMAN, 37th DIST. 'AN ACT EXCLUDING CERTAIN LOANS RECEIVED IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC FROM BEING INCLUDED AS REVENUE OR INCOME', to exclude certain loans provided to a small business in response to the COVID-19 pandemic from being included as revenue or income of a small business.

Proposed H.B. No. 5266 REP. TURCO, 27th DIST. 'AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF THE PROPERTY TAX CREDIT', to increase the amount of the property tax

credit under section 12-704c of the general statutes to one thousand dollars for taxes paid on a primary residence or motor vehicle.

Proposed H.B. No. 5267 REP. TURCO, 27th DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A PERSONAL INCOME TAX CREDIT FOR LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE PREMIUM PAYMENTS', to establish a credit against the personal income tax for premiums paid for long-term care insurance.

Proposed H.B. No. 5268 REP. BUCKBEE, 67th DIST. 'AN ACT REESTABLISHING THE JOB EXPANSION TAX CREDIT PROGRAM', to reestablish the job expansion tax credit program.

Proposed H.B. No. 5269 REP. SREDZINSKI, 112th DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A LOW VOLATILITY DIVIDEND STOCK INVESTMENT FUND', to require the State Treasurer to establish an investment fund that invests in low volatility dividend stocks and in which municipalities may invest municipal funds.

Proposed H.B. No. 5271 REP. CARNEY, 23rd DIST. 'AN ACT EXEMPTING SAFETY APPAREL FROM THE SALES AND USE TAXES', to exempt the sale of and the storage, use or other consumption of safety apparel from the sales and use taxes.
