INTRODUCTION OF BILLS HOUSE AND SENATE BILLS

On motion of Representative Rojas of the 9th District, the first reading of the following bills and resolutions was waived, the list of bills and resolutions as prepared by the Clerks was accepted, and the bills and resolutions referred to the committees as indicated thereon in concurrence.

GENERAL LAW

H.B. No. 5303 (COMM) GENERAL LAW. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF PREDATORY TELEMARKETING PRACTICES', to require the Department of Consumer Protection to conduct a study of the feasibility of strengthening prohibitions on predatory and unsolicited telemarketing.

VETERANS' AFFAIRS

H.B. No. 5592 (COMM) VETERANS' AFFAIRS. 'AN ACT REDEFINING "VETERAN" AND ESTABLISHING A QUALIFIED CONDITION REVIEW BOARD', to redefine "veteran" and to establish a Qualified Condition Review Board.

HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT

H.B. No. 5666 (COMM) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING GRANTS TO DISTRESSED MUNICIPALITIES FOR THE TRAINING OF VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS', to require the State Fire Administrator to issue grants to distressed municipalities for the training of volunteer firefighters.

COMMERCE

H.B. No. 5759 (COMM) COMMERCE. 'AN ACT REQUIRING NOTICE BEFORE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ANY DECLARATION, PROCLAMATION OR ORDER THAT AFFECTS BUSINESSES', to provide businesses with five days' notice before issuing any declaration, proclamation or order that restricts a business's ability to operate or capacity to do business.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY

H.B. No. 6050 (COMM) PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY. 'AN ACT REQUIRING A STUDY OF THE EFFECTS OF INCLUDING FIRE DISTRICTS IN THE PILOT PROGRAM', to study the effects of providing state grants in lieu of taxes to fire districts.

COMMERCE

H.B. No. 6121 (COMM) COMMERCE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PIPELINE FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES', to require the Department of Economic and Community Development to develop a plan to establish a workforce development pipeline for persons with disabilities.

HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT

H.B. No. 6231 (COMM) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT CONCERNING HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS FOR PART-TIME FACULTY EMPLOYED BY THE CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM', to require health insurance benefits for the part-time faculty employed by the Connecticut State University System who have taught not less than ninety credit hours during the preceding five years.

H.B. No. 6235 (COMM) HIGHER EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT ADVANCEMENT. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE "LEARN HERE, HEAL HERE" PROGRAM', to establish a "Learn Here, Heal Here" program to provide a tax rebate to psychiatrists who work in the state to purchase their first home in the state within ten years of graduation from medical school.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY

H.B. No. 6302 (COMM) PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE REGIONALIZATION OF CERTAIN PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATIONS CENTERS AND A STUDY OF CONSOLIDATION', to (1) provide incentives for public safety answering points to consolidate and (2) establish a working group to study the consolidation of public safety answering points.

HUMAN SERVICES

H.B. No. 6634 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ESSENTIAL SUPPORT PERSONS AND A STATE-WIDE VISITATION POLICY FOR RESIDENTS OF LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES', to allow long-term care facility residents to designate essential support persons who may visit and support their physical, emotional, psychological and socialization needs despite other visitation restrictions and to establish a state-wide visitation policy at long-term care facilities.

H.B. No. 6635 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING TEMPORARY FAMILY ASSISTANCE', to extend the time limit for temporary family assistance to sixty months, exempt benefits received during the COVID-19 public health emergency from the time limit, eliminate the penalties for families with children born after enrollment in the program and ensure benefits are adequate to meet the cost of living for beneficiaries.

H.B. No. 6636 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING COVID-19 AND ENHANCED FEDERAL MEDICAID FUNDING', to expand access to care under the Medicaid program by using enhanced federal matching funds provided to states during the COVID-19 pandemic to increase Medicaid provider rates.

H.B. No. 6637 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING STATE-WIDE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR DEAF, DEAF-BLIND AND HARD OF HEARING PERSONS', to establish a state-wide mental health services program to provide mental health services tailored to the specialized needs of deaf, deaf-blind and hard of hearing persons.

GENERAL LAW

S.B. No. 186 (COMM) GENERAL LAW. 'AN ACT ALLOWING PERSONS SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER TO OPERATE RIDES AT AMUSEMENT PARKS', to permit persons sixteen years of age or older to operate rides at amusement parks, with certain requirements.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY

S.B. No. 575 (COMM) PUBLIC SAFETY AND SECURITY. 'AN ACT CREATING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE REGULATION OF PROFESSIONAL BONDSMEN, BAIL ENFORCEMENT AGENTS AND SURETY BAIL BOND AGENTS', to establish a task force to study the regulation of professional bondsmen, bail enforcement agents and surety bail bond agents.

COMMERCE

S.B. No. 625 (COMM) COMMERCE. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A DATABASE OF STATE BUSINESSES, SUPPLY CHAINS AND WORKFORCE TOOLS', to require the Department of Economic and Community Development to develop a plan to establish a database of state businesses, supply chains and workforce tools .

HUMAN SERVICES

S.B. No. 1054 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A STATE HOME HEALTH AND HOSPICE OMBUDSMAN', to appoint a state ombudsman to monitor and respond to complaints and concerns regarding home health care and hospice care.

S.B. No. 1055 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGING AND DISABILITY SERVICES', to update statutes concerning the Department of Aging and Disability Services.

S.B. No. 1056 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT EXPANDING ACCESS TO MEDICAL ASSISTANCE', to expand access to Medicaid to persons under age sixty-five with income not exceeding two hundred per cent of the federal poverty level.

S.B. No. 1057 (RAISED) HUMAN SERVICES. 'AN ACT CONCERNING NURSING HOMES', to change the minimum staffing levels at nursing home facilities.

SPEAKER RITTER IN THE CHAIR

APPROPRIATIONS. H.B. No. 6555 (RAISED) (File No. 44) AN ACT CONCERNING LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT AND APPROVAL OF COVID-19 RELIEF FUNDS.

The bill was explained by Representative Walker of the 93rd who offered House Amendment Schedule "A" (LCO 5573) and moved its adoption.

The amendment was discussed by Representatives France of the 42nd and Candelora of the 86th.

On a voice vote the amendment was adopted.
 The Speaker ruled the amendment was technical.

The following is House Amendment Schedule "A" (LCO 5573):

Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

"Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) Notwithstanding any provision of the general statutes, not later than April 26, 2021, the Governor shall submit to the speaker of the House of Representatives and the president pro tempore of the Senate recommended allocations of federal funds designated for the state pursuant to the provisions of Subtitle M of Title IX of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, P.L. 117-2, as amended from time to time, except for any funds designated under the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. Not later than five days after receipt of the recommended allocations, the speaker and the president pro tempore shall submit the recommended allocations to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies. Said committee shall report their approval or modifications, if any, of such recommended allocations to the speaker and the president pro tempore not later than May 16, 2021. The final allocations of such funds shall be authorized by public or special act of the General Assembly. Disbursement of such funds shall be in accordance with such final allocations and no disbursement of such funds shall occur prior to such authorization.

Sec. 2. (*Effective from passage*) Not later than April 26, 2021, the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management shall submit a report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to appropriations and the budgets of state agencies. Such report shall include an overview of all funds received by the state pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, P.L. 116-136, as amended from time to time, and the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, P.L. 116-260, as amended from time to time, including a full accounting of all funds that have been disbursed and a plan for the disbursement of any remaining funds."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
