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## **INTRODUCTION OF BILLS SENATE AND HOUSE BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS**

On motion of Senator Duff of the 25<sup>th</sup>, the first reading of the following bills and resolutions was waived, the list of bills and resolutions as prepared by the Clerks was accepted, and the bills and resolutions referred to the Committees as indicated thereon in concurrence:

### **FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING**

S.B. No. **1094** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT AUTHORIZING BONDS OF THE STATE FOR CTNEXT AND THE INNOVATION PLACE PROGRAM', to provide funding for CTNext and the innovation place program.

S.B. No. **1095** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT EXPANDING THE ANGEL INVESTOR TAX CREDIT PROGRAM TO SOCIAL EQUITY APPLICANTS', to expand the angel investor tax credit program to cannabis establishments for which social equity applicants have been granted provisional licenses or licenses.

S.B. No. **1096** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE EXCHANGE OF EXCESS CREDITS WITH THE STATE AT A REDUCED RATE', to authorize corporations and affected business entities to exchange excess credits with the state at a reduced rate.

S.B. No. **1097** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING MEETINGS OF THE STATE BOND COMMISSION', to require the State Bond Commission to meet at least once each calendar quarter and the agenda for each meeting to be jointly agreed on by the Governor, the president pro tempore of the Senate and the speaker of the House of Representatives, in consultation with the minority leaders of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

S.B. No. **1098** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT AUTHORIZING BONDS OF THE STATE FOR PEDIATRIC EARLY LITERACY PROGRAMS', to fund the provision of pediatric early literacy programs in alliance districts.

S.B. No. **1099** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT AUTHORIZING BONDS OF THE STATE FOR A RESEARCH FACULTY RECRUITMENT AND HIRING PROGRAM BY THE UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT TO ENCOURAGE THE CREATION OF NEW BUSINESS VENTURES', to provide funding for a research faculty recruitment and hiring program by The University of Connecticut, with the goal of encouraging and facilitating the creation of new business ventures.

S.B. No. **1100** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE FAILURE TO FILE FOR CERTAIN GRAND LIST EXEMPTIONS', to allow certain persons to file for property tax exemptions, notwithstanding certain statutory deadlines.

S.B. No. **1101** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING CT RENAISSANCE AND CONCERNING INVESTMENTS IN RENAISSANCE ZONES', to require the establishment of the CT Renaissance to implement investments and project financing in eligible municipalities through designated renaissance zones, and to increase the funds for state investments in community banks and credit unions to promote community or economic development in such zones.

S.B. No. **1102** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A LOAN PROGRAM TO ASSIST TAXPAYERS WITH THE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY TAXES', to establish a loan program to assist taxpayers with the payment of certain real property taxes.

S.B. No. **1103** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING EMISSIONS AND DECIBEL LEVEL TESTING, THE TAXATION OF CERTAIN MOTORCYCLES AND PARTS AND THE PASSPORT TO THE PARKS FEE', to require emissions and decibel level testing for motor vehicles and motorcycles, establish a higher rate of sales and use taxes for motorcycles and aftermarket motorcycle mufflers that exceed the maximum allowable decibel level and limit the Passport to the Parks fee to one vehicle per owner.

S.B. No. **1104** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING COMMUNITY RESTORATION FUNDS', to implement certain community restoration and revitalization efforts through the establishment of community development

corporations, community development credit unions and community impact zones, using tax revenue from the sale of cannabis and cannabis products and deposits in lieu of taxes payments.

S.B. No. **1105** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT ELIMINATING THE PROPERTY TAX ON CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES AND ADJUSTING THE UNIFORM PROPERTY ASSESSMENT RATE', to eliminate the property tax on certain motor vehicles and adjust the uniform property assessment rate.

S.B. No. **1106** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE CONNECTICUT EQUITABLE INVESTMENT FUND AND DEDICATING CERTAIN REVENUES TO SAID FUND', to establish the Connecticut Equitable Investment Fund and council and dedicate certain revenues to said fund to be used for certain purposes.

S.B. No. **1107** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE TAXATION OF AMBULATORY SURGICAL CENTER SERVICES', to sunset the ambulatory surgical centers tax and subject ambulatory surgical center services to the sales tax.

S.B. No. **1108** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A CONNECTICUT NEW MARKETS TAX CREDIT PROGRAM', to establish a Connecticut new markets tax credit program for calendar years 2022 and 2023.

H.B. No. **6675** (RAISED) FINANCE, REVENUE AND BONDING. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A MUNICIPAL OPTION FOR A HOMESTEAD PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION', to authorize municipalities to establish a homestead property tax exemption.

(NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2021*) No insurance company shall issue a travel insurance policy in this state on or after October 1, 2021, that excludes coverage because the insured's spouse, child, dependent relative who resides in the insured's household or traveling companion dies by suicide. For the purposes of this section, "travel insurance" has the same meaning as provided in section 38a-398 of the general statutes."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
