"AN ACT CONCERNING IMMUNIZATIONS."

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and substitute the
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 38a-492r of the general statutes is
4 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective January*
5 *1, 2022*):

6 (a) Each individual health insurance policy providing coverage of the
7 type specified in subdivisions (1), (2), (4), (11) and (12) of section 38a-469
8 delivered, issued for delivery, renewed, amended or continued in this
9 state that provides coverage for prescription drugs shall provide
10 [coverage for] (1) coverage for immunizations recommended by the
11 American Academy of Pediatrics, American Academy of Family
12 Physicians and the American College of Obstetricians and
13 Gynecologists, and (2) with respect to immunizations that have in effect
14 a recommendation from the Advisory Committee on Immunization

15 Practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention with respect
 16 to the individual involved, coverage for such immunizations and at least
 17 a twenty-minute consultation between such individual and a health care
 18 provider authorized to administer such immunizations to such
 19 individual.

20 Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of section 38a-518r of the general statutes is
 21 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective January*
 22 *1, 2022*):

23 (a) Each group health insurance policy providing coverage of the type
 24 specified in subdivisions (1), (2), (4), (11) and (12) of section 38a-469
 25 delivered, issued for delivery, renewed, amended or continued in this
 26 state that provides coverage for prescription drugs shall provide
 27 [coverage for] (1) coverage for immunizations recommended by the
 28 American Academy of Pediatrics, American Academy of Family
 29 Physicians and the American College of Obstetricians and
 30 Gynecologists, and (2) with respect to immunizations that have in effect
 31 a recommendation from the Advisory Committee on Immunization
 32 Practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention with respect
 33 to the individual involved, coverage for such immunizations and at least
 34 a twenty-minute consultation between such individual and a health care
