"AN ACT CONCERNING IMMUNIZATIONS."

1 Strike subsection (e) of section 1 and insert the following in lieu
2 thereof:

3 "[~~(b)~~] (e) The definitions of adequate immunization shall reflect the
4 schedule for active immunization adopted pursuant to section 19a-7f
5 and be established by regulation adopted in accordance with the
6 provisions of chapter 54 by the Commissioner of Public Health, who
7 shall also be responsible for providing procedures under which [said]
8 such boards and [said] such similar governing bodies shall collect and
9 report immunization data on each child to the Department of Public
10 Health for (1) compilation and analysis by [said] the department, and
11 (2) release by the department of annual immunization rates for each
12 public and nonpublic school in the state, provided such immunization
13 data may not contain information that identifies a specific individual.
14 Such boards and such similar governing bodies shall inform its staff of
15 the definitions of adequate immunization and update its staff regarding

16 any revisions to such definitions as soon as practicable after such
17 definitions have been revised."

18 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
19 internal references accordingly:

20 "Sec. 501. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) Each administrator, teacher
21 and staff member employed by a local or regional board of education,
22 or similar body governing a nonpublic school or schools, shall receive
23 adequate immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus,
24 poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, haemophilus influenzae type B
25 and any other vaccine required by the schedule for active immunization
26 adopted pursuant to section 19a-7f of the general statutes as
27 recommended by the National Centers for Disease Control and
28 Prevention, and provide documentation of such immunization to the
29 local or regional board of education, or similar governing body.

30 Sec. 502. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) Each administrator, faculty
31 member and staff member employed by an institution of higher
32 education shall receive adequate immunization against diphtheria,
33 pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, haemophilus
34 influenzae type B and any other vaccine required by the schedule for
35 active immunization adopted pursuant to section 19a-7f of the general
36 statutes as recommended by the National Centers for Disease Control
37 and Prevention, and provide documentation of such immunization to
38 the local or regional board of education, or similar governing body.

39 Sec. 503. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) Each operator, administrator,
40 teacher and staff member of a child care center and group child care
41 home shall receive adequate immunization against diphtheria,
42 pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, haemophilus
43 influenzae type B and any other vaccine required by the schedule for
44 active immunization adopted pursuant to section 19a-7f of the general
45 statutes as recommended by the National Centers for Disease Control
46 and Prevention, and provide documentation of such immunization to
47 the local or regional board of education, or similar governing body.

48 Sec. 504. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) Each operator, administrator,
 49 teacher and staff member of a family child care home shall receive
 50 adequate immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus,
 51 poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, haemophilus influenzae type B
 52 and any other vaccine required by the schedule for active immunization
 53 adopted pursuant to section 19a-7f of the general statutes as
 54 recommended by the National Centers for Disease Control and
 55 Prevention, and provide documentation of such immunization to the
 56 local or regional board of education, or similar governing body.

57 Sec. 505. (NEW) (*Effective from passage*) Each operator, administrator,
 58 teacher and staff member of a youth camp shall receive adequate
 59 immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, poliomyelitis,
 60 measles, mumps, rubella, haemophilus influenzae type B and any other
 61 vaccine required by the schedule for active immunization adopted
 62 pursuant to section 19a-7f of the general statutes as recommended by
 63 the National Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and provide
 64 documentation of such immunization to the local or regional board of
 65 education, or similar governing body."
