Proposed [H.B. No. 5027](#) REP. DELNICKI, 14th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING THE BANKING COMMISSIONER TO ESTABLISH A FIRST-TIME HOMEBUYER SAVINGS ACCOUNT PROGRAM AND ESTABLISHING A TAX DEDUCTION FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO FIRST-TIME HOMEBUYER SAVINGS ACCOUNTS', to require the Banking Commissioner to establish a first-time homebuyer savings account program and to establish a tax deduction for contributions to first-time homebuyer savings accounts.
