Proposed <u>S.B. No. 819</u> SEN. FLEXER, 29th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE FISCAL STABILIZATION OF THE TOWN OF SCOTLAND', to increase state moneys to the town of Scotland to ensure the fiscal solvency of the municipality.

Proposed S.J. No. 13 SEN. LESSER, 9th DIST. 'RESOLUTION PROPOSING A STATE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO ALLOW SIXTEEN-YEAR-OLDS TO PREREGISTER TO VOTE, REGIONAL VOTING CENTERS AND EARLY VOTING', to amend the Constitution of the state to allow sixteen-year-olds to preregister to vote, regional voting centers and early voting.
