Wednesday, January 6, 2021

On Wednesday after the first Monday of January, A.D., 2021, the date by the Constitution of the State of Connecticut for the meeting of the General Assembly, the Senate was called to order by Secretary of State Dennis Merrill on the South Lawn of the Capitol due to COVID-19 pandemic. The Senate convened in the Senate Chamber in Hartford at 10:04 a.m. Secretary of State Dennis Merrill in the Chair.

The Senate was called to order by the Secretary of the State, Dennis Merrill.

THE CHAIR:

Good morning. I hereby call this chilly, unusual session to order. By the power vested in me by Connecticut General Statute Section 2-1, I, Dennis Merrill, Secretary of the State, acting as President of the Senate, call to order the 2021 Senate of the Connecticut General Assembly. Let us please join together for prayer. Senate Chaplain Rabbi Philip Lazowski.

SENATE CHAPLAIN RABBI PHILIP LAZOWSKI:

Thank you. Our thought for today is from Exodus 15:26, "I the Lord am your healer." Friends, we have not seen each other since the onset of this terrible pandemic, which has taken so many lives here in

Connecticut, around the nation and around the world. According to *The Hartford Courant*, as of January 3rd, 2021, in the State of Connecticut, we have lost 6,099 lives to the virus. Everyone knows a family who has seen loss as a result of this terrible sickness. As we begin the new season of the Connecticut Senate, let us pause a moment of silence for the dead and let us pray for comfort for all their mourners. A moment of silence.

O Merciful God on High, bring under the soft sheltering wings of Your Divine Presence of the souls of the women, men and youth who have perished in this terrible coronavirus pandemic.

To those who suffer with illness, we ask for healing. Strengthen the hands of the caregivers, the doctors, the nurses and health workers who extend themselves every day on behalf of the afflicted and all our responders. Grant them strength, protection, and success.

Guide and bless the newly elected Senators and the returned Senators. Bless them all. Keep them in good health, as they may work together to pass wise laws, guide the Senate -- guide the Senate to address the urgent and important issues of caring for the most vulnerable and restoring livelihoods of workers and businesspeople who stand at the brink of disaster. Open their hearts and minds of this body to protect and restore the sick, the poor and the needy.

Bless the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Martin Looney, and all the Members of the Senate to work together wisely and effectively to legislate for the good of the people.

Bless the Governor, Ned Lamont and the Lieutenant Governor, Susan Bysiewicz to govern, to restore prosperity and security to all the people of Connecticut.

May this time be remembered in the years to come as a moment when we came together to work, to heal our society and serve the common good. Hear us as we pray and let us all say amen.

Michael Jefferson is elected Clerk of the Senate by  
acclamation. Congratulations, Mr. Jefferson.

Now you need to come forward for the Oath of Office.

Okay. You do solemnly swear that you will support  
the Constitution of the United States and the  
Constitution of the State of Connecticut, so long as  
you continue a citizen thereof, and that you will  
faithfully discharge according to law the duties of  
office of Senate Clerk, to the best of your  
abilities, so help you God?

THE CLERK:

I do.

THE CHAIR:

Congratulations, sir. (Applause)

THE CLERK:

Thank you. As Senate Clerk, I now appoint Americo Carchia as my Assistant. Assistant Clerk of the Senate, will you come forth, raise your right hand.

Do you solemnly swear that you will support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Connecticut, so long as you continue a citizen thereof, and that you will faithfully discharge, according to law, the duties of the Office of Assistant Senate Clerk to the best of your abilities, so help you God?

ASSISTANT CLERK:

I do.

THE CLERK:

Thank you. (Applause)

THE CHAIR:

Thank you very much.

ASSISTANT CLERK:

Thank you.

THE CHAIR:

Now, I will now entertain nominations for President Pro Tempore of the State Senate. Senator Duff.

SENATOR BOB DUFF (25TH):

Good morning, everybody, and congratulations to our new Senators and our returning Senators. Thank you,

Madam Secretary and congratulations to our Clerk and our Assistant Clerk.

And it gives me great pleasure and honor to nominate Senator Martin Looney for another term as our Senate President Pro Tempore. I've had the great privilege and honor of being the Majority Leader under Senate President Martin Looney for the last six years and I look forward to continuing another two years under his leadership.

Senator Looney cares about everyone in our state, not just those in New Haven and his district, and speaks for the voiceless in our state. He's someone who has spent his life dedicated to public service and for the betterment of the people of the State of Connecticut. This is Senator Looney's 41st Session and one that is -- has had remarkable accomplishments over that time.

And so, it is in the best interest of this body and the State of Connecticut to continue to have Senator Looney as our Senate President Pro Tempore. Thank you so much.

THE CHAIR:

Thank you, Senator Duff. Do we have a second?  
Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KEVIN KELLY (21TH):

Thank you very much, and congratulations to all Senators and happy new year to everybody who is present with us this morning.

On this eve of a very interesting, and I'm going to say a very challenging legislative session, I too

rise in support of the nomination of Senator Looney as the President Pro Tempore. I have had the opportunity and privilege to be a Senator for the past ten years and have seen his leadership, and I certainly hope that I have the same type of relationship that I know my predecessor had with Senator Looney.

He is somebody who believes very, very dearly that this is a very collegial and collaborative institution and that we are all honored and privileged to serve not only in that institution but under his leadership. So, I look forward to working with him and all the voices of the Senate to make sure that we advance the causes of our state and make it a better place to live, work and raise a family. Thank you. (Applause)

THE CHAIR:

Thank you very much. Are there any other nominations? Are there any further nominations? If not, I declare the nominations closed. Martin Looney. (Applause) Mr. Senator.

THE CLERK:

I have the distinct honor of swearing in my dear friend, Senator Looney, as President Pro Tempore.

Senator Looney, you do solemnly swear that you will support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Connecticut so long as you continue a citizen thereof, and that you will faithfully discharge, according to law, the duties of the Office of President Pro Tempore to the best of your abilities, so help you God?



SENATOR MARTIN LOONEY (11TH):

I do.

THE CLERK:

Congratulations, sir. (Applause)

SENATOR MARTIN LOONEY (11TH):

Thank you so much, Mr. Clerk. And I wanted to thank our wonderful Majority Leader Senator Duff and Senator Kelly for their very kind remarks. I look forward to working closely with Senator Kelly and his caucus may have some additional remarks when we get -- get inside. But this is a deep and profound honor for me to be selected for the fourth time as the Senate President Pro Tempore. We look forward to all of the good work that we will do together in the 2021 and 2022 term.

Madam Secretary, thank you so much. Madam Lieutenant Governor, thank you. And again, this is such a great blessing in my life. Thank you all. (Applause)

THE CHAIR:

Congratulations, Senator Looney. We could have no finer champion in this state.

And now I will turn over presiding of this Chamber to our Lieutenant Governor Susan Bysiewicz. Thank you very much for allowing me to be President and congratulations to all of you. (Applause)

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SUSAN BYSIEWICZ:

Thank you so much, Madam Secretary. Such a pleasure serving with you, and congratulations to all the newly sworn-in Senators, and congratulations, Senator Looney. Senator Looney, would you please proceed with your announcements?

SENATOR MARTIN LOONEY (11TH):

Thank you. At this point, Madam President, the only announcement that I have, one I'm very, very proud to make, is the announcement that Senator Bob Duff of Norwalk has once again been selected to be the Majority Leader of the State Senate for his fourth term. I look forward to that partnership and the continuation of the wonderful friendship that we have-- that we have had and continue to have, and the steadiness and constancy of his leadership within our Caucus and within our Chamber. Thank you, Madam President.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SUSAN BYSIEWICZ:

Thank you so much, Senator Looney. Congratulations, Senator Duff and congratulations, Senator Kelly. And I would now call on Senate Majority Leader, Senator Duff.

SENATOR BOB DUFF (25TH):

Thank you. Thank you, Madam President, and it's good to see you here as well. Madam President, we're gonna move -- I move that we adjourn. I'm sorry. I move that we recess so that we can do -- finish our business upstairs, which I believe will be the Senate President, Senate President Pro Tempore, Majority Leader and Minority Leader, and we will continue there. So, we will recess and reconvene upstairs. Thank you, Madam President.

Congratulations again, everybody. We'll see you all later.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SUSAN BYSIEWICZ:

So ordered.

(On the motion of Senator Duff of the 25th, the Senate recessed.)

THE CHAIR:

Good morning. Will the Senate please come to order? Happy New Year. Good morning, everyone. Senator Looney, good morning and congratulations.

SENATOR MARTIN LOONEY (11TH):

Thank you, Madam President. Happy New Year to you.

THE CHAIR:

Senator Duff, good morning. Congratulations to you, sir.

SENATOR BOB DUFF (25TH):

Thank you, Madam President, and good morning. And good morning to everybody who is here and not here today, in our socially distanced and safe way of opening day.

I would like to yield to Senator Looney, I know who has remarks for-- in becoming Senate President Pro Tempore again. And in the spirit of not having him or anyone else freeze outside, I think he felt that it was good to bring the remarks inside. And so, I would like to yield to Senator Looney.

THE CHAIR:

Senator Looney. Do you accept the yield, sir?

SENATOR MARTIN LOONEY (11TH):

I do, Madam President, and thank you. Thank you so much to you for your kindness, your leadership, your insight as a public policy leader for so many years and for your courageous presiding in this Chamber.

Madam President, thanks to my colleagues certainly for electing me to a fourth term as Senate President Pro Tempore. Other than the blessings of family life with my wife, Ellen, who is missing opening day for, I believe, the first time in 39 years today not being with us, our son, Michael, and our grandchildren, Matthew, Anna, and Isabel, and some cherished longtime friendships that go back several decades. Apart from that, having your confidence, my colleagues, and trust is the most cherished honor of my life.

I'm most deeply grateful for the people of the 11th Senate District for the past 28 years, and the people of the 96th House District for 12 years before that, for the opportunity to serve in this beloved place and to know that I am part of a group that's been entrusted with work that is valuable, consequential, and thoroughly absorbing every single day. And that has been the case for the last 40 years, in my case.

I thank our Great Majority Leader Duff, who succeeded me six years ago as the Majority Leader and has been a deep well of good judgment, sound policy insight, as well as becoming a close friend

during those years. And that judgment and that insight that Bob possesses will be needed more than ever in the next two years.

I'm also so pleased in these challenging times that we have so many passionate, highly gifted, and idealistic members in our Senate Democratic Caucus, ready for the challenges of the next two years. I thank Senator Kelly, Senator Formica, and the Republican Senate Caucus for their commitment to public service and a belief in our system; and their Washington colleagues have much to learn from them.

I want to acknowledge our superb staff, especially Finney Morrow and Courtney Cullinan, and Joel Rudikoff in particular who have been so involved in the preparation for this session. The reworking of our rules in a way to try to creatively prepare us for a new way of doing business and do it in a way that-- that reflects the best traditions of the Senate.

And all that they have done prior to the start of the session has been so important behind the scenes to prepare us for this day and for the days ahead, so that we can actually have a productive Session in the midst of this pandemic.

A note of personal gratitude to outgoing Republican Senate Leader Len Fasano, outgoing Speaker Joe Aresimowicz, and outgoing House Republican Leader Themis Klarides for the quality of their service and their dedication and their love of this General Assembly over the years.

In fact, last night, Senator Duff and Speaker Ritter and I gathered with the three of them for a virtual cocktail party and a toast to reminisce about all of

our years in service together and the good times and the hard times that we've had, and the friendships that have developed during those years of shared leadership. Again, something not likely to be seen in Washington these days.

Looking ahead, Madam President, we of course face policy challenges a lot more formidable than the technical ones of adjusting to Zoom after Zoom after Zoom after Zoom. Adopting a biennial budget must be accomplished in a way that does not fail to meet the mandate that the people of our state expect their state government to provide sufficient and significant support for social services for the frail and the dependent, for the highest quality in public education from pre-K through graduate and professional education.

For property tax reform for municipalities, in recognition of the reality that it is the local property tax and not any tax directly levied by the state that people find the most inequitable and the most burdensome.

We know that the pandemic has taken so many lives, and blighted so many others. It has also revealed the inequities in our health care and health insurance. We must respond with a willingness to evaluate every physical and mental health issue in light of that, and in light of the urgent commitment to racial equity and social justice that has to be our renewed vision [inaudible].

But we also need to pursue equity in urgent economic development and development of affordable housing and [inaudible] in every aspect of our economy. We also have to recognize that we have to have a clear vision to enhance corporate activity in the way in

which we raise revenue in the state. We have to remind ourselves each day that we are not primarily just a collection of 169 separate and visible economies, but are in fact the single state of Connecticut.

Also as one who's grant base per capita range from \$15,000 to \$734,000 per person, and therein is our economic problem.

Also, Madam President, I believe we have to recognize that when we received yesterday the results from the State of Georgia that equity and access to quality health care and education and a commitment to social justice are not fringe issues of the left, but are fundamental American issues that are cared for and cared about deeply and passionately by the mainstream of people in the United States.

Madam President, I believe that we have the capacity. With goodwill, we can deliver, in partnership with Governor Lamont's administration, a productive state government; one that is enlightened, compassionate, and efficient, and that that state government can be a force for good, especially in times of crisis. And that is our fervent belief and one in which we need to continue to keep the faith as we go forward.

Thank you, Madam President and thanks to everyone for this voyage we are about to begin on, which is in some ways is so traditional, but in other ways, this year will be so new. Thank you, Madam President.

THE CHAIR:

Thank you, Senator Looney. Senator Kelly, will you remark, sir? And congratulations to you and Happy New Year.

SENATOR KEVIN KELLY (21TH):

Thank you very much, Madam President. And like Senator Looney, I am very excited about the prospects of not only this Session, but the next Session and the opportunity to be back in the people's building and to get the voice of the people of Connecticut and particularly the middle class back at the table and being heard.

These are challenging times, but as much as things change in the State of Connecticut, they do stay the same. And there are very decent, good, and hard-working families across our state that want to make our state a better place in which to live, work and raise a family.

And to that end, I look forward to the next two years of working for those issues and working across the aisle to make sure that we can make Connecticut that better place to live, for all people of Connecticut.

Now, I would be remised if I didn't also recognize as a new leader that I have a Deputy in Senator Paul Formica, and I have been blessed that he has decided to also serve with me. And I'm also blessed and humbled by the support of our Caucus and the good Senators in our Caucus who have decided to step forward in challenging times to make sure that their voice is heard, and to make a commitment and a sacrifice on behalf of the people of Connecticut.



We do have a couple of individuals who were with us last session, but are not with us today. Both George Logan and Gennaro Bizzarro unfortunately did not make it. And to them, I would like to sincerely thank them for their service on behalf of their districts and the sacrifices that they've made for the people of Connecticut.

And I'd also like to recognize my predecessor, somebody who was very instrumental in helping me become the Senator who I am. From the very beginning ten years ago, he helped me, he guided me, he taught me very much and it was a blessing to be in the Caucus with such a leader and to learn from somebody who was so committed, not only to the people of Connecticut and his family, but to this institution itself. And that is Senator Len Fasano.

The State is a better place, I know this institution is a better place, because of the commitment that he made to both. And I thank him for his sacrifice and service of 18 years to the State of Connecticut and also the sacrifices of his family to give him to us, so that we could benefit from all the things that he did to make us a better place.

And lastly, while we're talking about service and sacrifice, I must comment that I myself have a family. My wife, Cindy, like Senator Looney's spouse, is not able to be here with us today. It's the first time she's missed also. But I couldn't do what I do without her support, love and devotion. As well as our family, our four kids, our grandchildren, and the difficult time that they're going through now didn't allow them to be with us today, but I'm certainly blessed and grateful for the sacrifices that they make on my behalf so that I

can be with you not only here today, but throughout Session.

So once again, just thank you. I look forward to working with everyone and I am hopeful and optimistic that Connecticut will get through this, and we will not only get through this, but we will be better for the experience. Thank you.

THE CHAIR:

Senator Kelly, thank you so much. Senator Duff.

SENATOR BOB DUFF (25TH):

Thank you, Madam President. Madam President, also again I want to just extend my congratulations to Senator Kelly and Senator Formica on their ascension to leadership. Once again, I congratulate my partner and friend, our Leader of the Senate, Senator Looney, for all his work and dedication to the people of the State of Connecticut and for laying out a bold, visionary agenda for the next two years for us to consider.

And the fact that Senator Looney has dedicated his life to public service and the work he has done doesn't go unnoticed, and we certainly appreciate that.

And we all, I think, as Senators want to take a moment and then assuming you, Madam President as well, want to thank our families for their sacrifices as well for what they do and for their support in the background of us, so that we're able to be here.

I just also want to take a moment again to congratulate our Clerk and our Assistant Clerk on their elections and appointments. We couldn't do without them and we certainly appreciate their work.
