AN ACT CONCERNING THE SUSPENSION OF CERTAIN GAS TAXES, THE EXTENSION OF FREE BUS SERVICE, BOTTLE DEPOSIT LABELS AND FUNDING FOR THE CONNECTICUT PREMIUM PAY PROGRAM AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Section 1 of special act 22-2, as amended by section 431 of
- 2 public act 22-118, is amended to read as follows (*Effective from passage*):
- 3 (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraphs (A) and (B) of
- 4 subdivision (2) of subsection (a) of section 12-458 of the general statutes,
- 5 (1) from April 1, 2022, to [November 30] <u>December 31</u>, 2022, inclusive,
- 6 the tax imposed under said subparagraphs shall not apply to fuels or
- 7 gasohol sold or used by a distributor in this state, and (2) from January
- 8 1, 2023, to April 30, 2023, inclusive, the tax imposed under said
- 9 subparagraphs on fuels or gasohol sold or used by a distributor in this
- 10 state shall apply at the following rates per gallon: (A) From January 1,

- 11 2023, to January 31, 2023, inclusive, five cents; (B) from February 1, 2023,
- 12 to February 28, 2023, inclusive, ten cents; (C) from March 1, 2023, to
- 13 March 31, 2023, inclusive, fifteen cents; and (D) from April 1, 2023, to
- 14 April 30, 2023, inclusive, twenty cents. Nothing in this section shall be
- 15 construed to affect the tax due pursuant to subparagraphs (C) to (E),
- 16 inclusive, of subdivision (2) of subsection (a) of section 12-458 of the
- 17 general statutes on propane, natural gas or diesel sold or used by a
- distributor in this state. As used in this section, "distributor" and "fuels"
- 19 have the same meanings as provided in section 12-455a of the general
- 20 statutes and "gasohol" has the same meaning as provided in section 14-
- 21 1 of the general statutes.
- 22 (b) [During the period set forth in subsection (a) of this section] <u>From</u>
- 23 April 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, inclusive, each retail dealer shall
- 24 reduce the per-gallon price of fuels or gasohol sold by such retail dealer
- in an amount equal to the amount of the reduction in such tax pursuant
- 26 to <u>subdivision (1) of subsection (a) of this section</u>. <u>From January 1, 2023</u>,
- 27 to April 30, 2023, inclusive, each retail dealer shall maintain such
- 28 reduction, except that the amount of such reduction shall be decreased
- 29 per gallon as follows: (1) From January 1, 2023, to January 31, 2023,
- 30 inclusive, by five cents; (2) from February 1, 2023, to February 28, 2023,
- 31 inclusive, by ten cents; (3) from March 1, 2023, to March 31, 2023,
- 32 inclusive, by fifteen cents; and (4) from April 1, 2023, to April 30, 2023,
- 33 <u>inclusive, by twenty cents.</u>
- 34 (c) A violation of subsection (b) of this section shall be deemed an
- unfair or deceptive trade practice under subsection (a) of section 42-110b
- of the general statutes. Any retail dealer that is alleged to have violated
- 37 subsection (b) of this section may avail themselves of the affirmative
- 38 defenses set forth in subdivision (4) of subsection (c) of section 14-332a
- 39 of the general statutes.
- Sec. 2. Section 41 of special act 21-15, as amended by section 306 of
- 41 public act 21-2 of the June special session, section 3 of special act 22-2,
- 42 section 10 of public act 22-118 and section 1 of public act 22-146, is
