sHB 5165

AN ACT CONCERNING THE STATE PLAN OF CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT.

SUMMARY

Under current law, the Office of Policy and Management (OPM) secretary must revise the State Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD) every five years and submit a final proposed plan to the Continuing Legislative Committee on State Planning and Development (Continuing Committee), which, after a public hearing, may recommend the General Assembly approve or disapprove it (CGS § 16a-30). (The POCD helps state agencies make decisions consistent with the state's development and conservation goals.)

The bill instead requires the OPM secretary to revise the plan in the year immediately before the year in which the General Assembly will adopt it, but no more than four years after it was last adopted. The bill establishes a schedule for the next POCD revision, specifying that the:

1. draft revised plan is due to the Continuing Committee for preliminary review before September 1, 2023;
2. OPM secretary may begin further revisions after December 1, 2023; and
3. first revised plan must be made publicly available by March 1, 2024.

After making the first revision available, as under existing law, the OPM secretary must hold public hearings on the plan and solicit comments. Under the bill, the OPM secretary must submit the final proposed 2025-2030 POCD to the Continuing Committee by December 1, 2024.
