AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF STATE MARSHALS' HEALTH BENEFITS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The State Marshal Commission,
2 established pursuant to section 6-38b of the general statutes, shall
3 conduct a study of state marshals' health benefits. Such study shall
4 include, but need not be limited to, (1) the average hours per week state
5 marshals spend performing services on behalf of the state, (2) what, if
6 any, subsidized health care state marshals currently receive, and (3) any
7 recommendations for legislation concerning the improvement of health
8 benefits for state marshals, including, but not limited to, whether state
9 marshals' benefits should be provided by the partnership plan pursuant
10 to sections 3-123aaa to 3-123hhh, inclusive, of the general statutes or in
11 the same manner as state employees under section 5-259 of the general
12 statutes. Not later than January 1, 2024, the commission shall submit a
13 report of the results of such study to the joint standing committee of the
14 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor and
15 public employees, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of
16 the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
