**"AN ACT CONCERNING A TITLE IX COMPLIANCE TOOLKIT FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS."**

1 Strike subsection (b) of section 1 in its entirety and substitute the  
2 following in lieu thereof:

3 "(b) The Title IX compliance toolkit shall include:

4 (1) Training for school administrators, Title IX coordinators, school  
5 personnel, students and parents and guardians of students that includes  
6 (A) information regarding the prevention, identification and response  
7 to adult sexual misconduct in schools, as described in the United States  
8 Department of Education's "Training Guide for Administrators and  
9 Educators on Addressing Adult Sexual Misconduct in the School  
10 Setting", and (B) research and data regarding the prevalence of child  
11 sexual abuse, adult sexual misconduct and the unique risk to sexual  
12 abuse for students with disabilities or who are lesbian, gay, bisexual,  
13 transgender, queer or another sexual orientation or gender identity;

14 (2) A model antidiscrimination and abuse prevention policy and  
15 procedures that include, but are not limited to, policies addressing the  
16 needs of students with disabilities or who are lesbian, gay, bisexual,  
17 transgender, queer or another sexual orientation or gender identity;

18 (3) A summary of applicable state and federal statutory and  
19 regulatory requirements and how such requirements affect the rights of  
20 students, including students with disabilities or who are lesbian, gay,  
21 bisexual, transgender, queer or another sexual orientation or gender  
22 identity, to be free from discrimination, harassment and abuse;

23 (4) Provisions relating to the process for reporting an incident of adult  
24 sexual misconduct, including documents accessible to parents and  
25 guardians of students, students, school personnel and administrators;

26 (5) Requirements for investigating reports of adult sexual  
27 misconduct, including information regarding the need to offer safety  
28 planning and services to the complainant or victim;

29 (6) An explanation of the Title IX complaint procedures, including,  
30 but not limited to, the various methods accessible to parents and  
31 guardians of students, students, school personnel and administrators of  
32 submitting complaints;

33 (7) Information explaining the right of an individual to seek redress  
34 from the Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities and the  
35 United States Department of Health and Human Services' Office for  
36 Civil Rights that is accessible to parents and guardians of students,  
37 students, school personnel and administrators;

38 (8) Procedures for publishing and disseminating information to  
39 parents and guardians of students, students, school personnel and  
40 administrators from the Connecticut School Health Survey,  
41 administered pursuant to section 10-217h of the general statutes, and  
42 school climate assessment instruments, completed pursuant to section  
43 10-222d of the general statutes;

44 (9) Information relating to personnel and resources at the state and  
45 federal level that are available to provide ongoing technical assistance  
46 and support to local and regional boards of education with regard to  
47 such boards' compliance with Title IX requirements;

48 (10) Information relating to resources that are available to provide  
49 support to students, educators and parents and guardians regarding  
50 prevention, identification and response to child sexual harassment,  
51 discrimination and abuse; and

52 (11) Information regarding the standards and guidelines relating to  
53 eligibility criteria for transgender participation in state intramural and  
54 interscholastic athletics adopted or issued by the International Olympic  
55 Committee and how such standards and guidelines may be  
56 implemented."
