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### **OFA Fiscal Note**

#### **Potential Minimal Revenue Loss**

The amendment specifies that volunteer departments found in violation of the bill's provisions would be required to attend occupational health and safety (OSHA) training in lieu of civil penalties. This results in a potential minimal revenue loss beginning in FY 24.

From FY 19 through FY 23 year-to-date, these volunteer entities have paid between \$800 and \$10,000 annually in OSHA penalties.
