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### ***OFA Fiscal Note***

#### ***Revenue Gain***

The amendment strikes the language of the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact, replacing it with language that results in the fiscal impact described by section below. Other provisions of the amendment are not anticipated to result in a fiscal impact to the state or municipalities.

**Section 1 and 9** create new Department of Public Health (DPH) licensure categories for blood collection facilities and source plasma donation centers, starting 10/1/23, with initial and biennial renewal license fees of \$200. The revenue gain to the General Fund from the new licensure categories will be dependent upon the number of initial and renewal licenses issued by DPH.

**Sections 43-47** create a new DPH licensure category for Music Therapists, and a temporary permit for the practice of music therapy under certain circumstances. The revenue gain to the General Fund from the new licensure category and temporary permit will be dependent upon the number of initial and renewal licenses, and temporary permits, issued by DPH. The initial application fee is \$315, with an annual renewal fee of \$195. The temporary permit for the practice of music therapy is valid for one year after attaining a bachelor's degree or higher

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for a fee of \$50. It is not renewable.
