No Fiscal Impact

The amendment adds a new provision that allows a plan sponsor of a health insurance policy (e.g., an employer) to consent to the electronic transmission of all communications pertaining to such policy, including “explanation of benefits” communications, on behalf of the plan’s enrollees, as long as a covered individual can opt back in to receive paper communications at any time. This is not anticipated to have a fiscal impact to the state or municipalities.

The amendment also adds a provision that brings forward the start date of certain contract rules required in passed House Bill 6782 of the current session, as amended by House Amendment Schedule "A". As that provision has no anticipated fiscal impact, changing the timing of it also has no fiscal impact.
