#### **Explanation**

The amendment, which requires the Department of Labor (DOL) to hold hearings under the Uniform Administrative Procedure Act for alleged violations of the bill's provisions, results in a cost to DOL of \$80,529 for one part-time Staff Attorney to conduct hearings.
