Explanation

The amendment removes the language requiring the Personal Care Attendant (PCA) Workforce Council to act on behalf of consumer employers of PCAs for purposes of the underlying bill, which eliminates the associated fiscal impact to the Departments of Social Services and Developmental Services.

The amendment also: 1) clarifies a number of definitions under the bill, 2) specifies that leave can be taken beginning 100 days after commencement of employment, 3) maintains (rather than increases) the current maximum amount of leave an employee can accrue, and 4) eliminates various provisions of the underlying bill relating to its

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enforcement. This does not change the fiscal impacts to the Department of Labor and State Comptroller- Fringe Benefits account identified in the fiscal note on the underlying bill.
