1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. Section 54-224 of the general statutes is repealed and the
4 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective from passage*):

5 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section and subsection
6 (f) of section 46b-38b, the state or any agent, employee or officer thereof
7 shall not be liable for (1) the failure to afford the victim of a crime any of
8 the rights provided pursuant to any provision of the general statutes, or
9 (2) the failure to provide the victim of a crime with any notice pursuant
10 to any provision of the general statutes.

11 (b) Any member of the Board of Pardons and Paroles shall be
12 personally liable for (1) the failure to afford the victim of a crime any of
13 the rights provided pursuant to any provision of the general statutes, (2)

14 the failure to provide the victim of a crime with any notice pursuant to
15 any provision of the general statutes, or (3) any damage or injury caused
16 for failure to properly perform such member's duties within the scope
17 of such member's appointment."
