House Bill No. 5317

*House of Representatives, March 25, 2024*

The Committee on Public Health reported through REP. MCCARTHY VAHEY of the 133rd Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the bill ought to pass.

***AN ACT REQUIRING A STUDY CONCERNING THE FUNDING FOR AND EFFECTIVENESS OF THE COMMUNITY GUN VIOLENCE INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION PROGRAM.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The Commissioners of Public Health  
2 and Revenue Services and the Secretary of the Office of Policy and  
3 Management shall jointly study the sustainability of funding for the  
4 community gun violence intervention and prevention program  
5 established pursuant to section 19a-112i of the general statutes and the  
6 effectiveness of such program in preventing and otherwise reducing  
7 gun violence in the state. Such study shall include, but need not be  
8 limited to, an examination of the potential sources of funding for such  
9 program. Not later than January 1, 2025, the commissioners and  
10 secretary shall jointly report, in accordance with the provisions of  
11 section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of  
12 the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to public  
13 health and appropriations and the budgets of state agencies regarding  
14 the outcome of the study.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

The bill, which requires a study by 1/1/2025 of the sustainability of funding for, and the effectiveness of, the Department of Public Health's (DPH's) community gun violence intervention and prevention program by DPH, the Department of Revenue Services, and the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management, is not anticipated to result in a fiscal impact to the state or municipalities.
