Substitute House Bill No. 5458

House of Representatives, April 22, 2024

The Committee on Housing reported through REP. FELIPE of the 130th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING HOMELESSNESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2024*) (a) As used in this section,
2 "Connecticut Housing Engagement and Support Services" or "CHESS"
3 means a home and community-based services program established
4 pursuant to a Medicaid state plan amendment under Section 1915(i) of
5 the Social Security Act and a Medicaid waiver pursuant to Section
6 1915(b)(4) of the Social Security Act to improve housing stability and
7 health outcomes for persons in accordance with federally approved
8 criteria.

9 (b) The Commissioner of Social Services, in consultation with the
10 Commissioners of Housing and Mental Health and Addiction Services,
11 shall develop a strategic plan to improve outcomes for participants in
12 the CHESS program and to reduce housing instability state-wide. The
13 plan shall include, but need not be limited to: (1) Any amendments to
14 the state plan or waiver programs established pursuant to Sections
15 1915(i) and 1915(b)(4) of the Social Security Act necessary to achieve the

16 goals of the strategic plan, (2) streamlining multiagency administrative
 17 procedures to ensure timely benefits to persons who have experienced
 18 or are at risk of homelessness, and (3) exploring and applying for federal
 19 approval for additional Medicaid waiver programs or Medicaid state
 20 plan amendments to target social determinants of health with support,
 21 including, but not limited to, housing, nutritional and health
 22 management supports. For purposes of this section, "social
 23 determinants of health" means the conditions in which people are born,
 24 grow, work and age.

25 (c) Not later than January 1, 2025, the Commissioner of Social
 26 Services, in consultation with the Commissioners of Housing and
 27 Mental Health and Addiction Services, shall file a report, in accordance
 28 with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, with the joint
 29 standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of
 30 matters relating to aging, children, housing, human services and public
 31 health. The report shall include, but need not be limited to: (1) Metrics
 32 related to health, housing and economic stability of participants in the
 33 CHES program, (2) plans and progress regarding streamlining
 34 multiagency administrative procedures in such program, (3)
 35 identification of additional Medicaid waiver programs or state plan
 36 amendments to address social determinants of health, and (4) a timeline
 37 for applications for such Medicaid waiver programs or state plan
 38 amendments.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Explanation

The bill requires the Department of Social Services (DSS) to develop a strategic plan, in consultation with the Departments of Housing and Mental Health and Addiction Services, to improve outcomes for participants in the Connecticut Housing Engagement and Support Services (CHESS) program and to reduce housing instability. This is not anticipated to result in a fiscal impact as the agencies have the expertise necessary to meet the requirements of the bill.
