***RESOLUTION REMANDING THE CLAIM AGAINST THE STATE OF JOHN DICKERSON TO THE CLAIMS COMMISSIONER FOR ACTION CONSISTENT WITH SAID COMMISSIONER'S PRIOR DETERMINATION.***

- 3 General Assembly and is remanded to said commissioner for action
- 4 consistent with said commissioner's determination rendered on such file

**Explanation**

The bill remands the decision, file number 23764, of the Claims Commissioner back to said commissioner for action consistent with the determination rendered on June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023, on the grounds that it lacks statutory authority to be before the General Assembly. This may result in potential costs to the state related to any future claim award or settlement.
