Senate Bill No. 196

Senate, April 4, 2024

The Committee on Environment reported through SEN. LOPES of the 6th Dist., Chairperson of the Committee on the part of the Senate, that the bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE HARVESTING OF RABBITS FOR THE LOCAL FOOD SUPPLY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2024*) The Commissioner of
2 Agriculture shall be the state official in charge of inspecting any
3 producer and any producer that also operates as a rabbit processing
4 facility. Any inspection conducted pursuant to this section by the
5 commissioner, or the commissioner's designated agent, shall be
6 consistent with the requirements of any applicable provision of the
7 Code of Federal Regulations, including, but not limited to, any health,
8 sanitary and safety-related provision. Rabbit processing facilities that
9 have passed Department of Agriculture facility inspections pursuant to
10 this section shall be designated as approved food sources for household
11 consumers, restaurants, hotels, boarding houses and retail food
12 establishments. For purposes of this section, "producer" means any
13 person who is engaged in farming, as defined in section 1-1 of the
14 general statutes, and who breeds, raises or keeps not more than one

15 thousand rabbits in a calendar year for the purpose of food production.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

OLR Bill Analysis**SB 196*****AN ACT CONCERNING THE HARVESTING OF RABBITS FOR THE LOCAL FOOD SUPPLY.*****SUMMARY**

This bill generally imposes inspection standards on rabbit processing facilities and deems certain inspected facilities as approved food sources for human consumption.

Specifically, the bill makes the agriculture commissioner the state official in charge of inspecting rabbit producers and processing facilities. It defines a “producer” as a farmer who breeds, raises, or keeps up to 1,000 rabbits in a year for food production purposes. The bill requires that inspections done by the commissioner or his designated agent be consistent with federal health, sanitation, and safety regulations. It also designates a rabbit processing facility that passes inspection as an approved food source for household consumers, restaurants, hotels, boarding houses, and retail food establishments.
