***AN ACT MAKING TECHNICAL REVISIONS TO PROVISIONS
CONCERNING STATE CONTRACTING.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 4e-10 of the general statutes is
2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*
3 *1, 2024*):

4 (a) On or before July 1, 2010, the board shall submit to the Governor
5 and the General Assembly such legislation as is necessary to permit state
6 contracting agencies, not including [quasi-publics] quasi-public
7 agencies, institutions of higher education, and municipal procurement
8 processes utilizing state funds, to carry out their functions under
9 statutes and regulations concerning procurement.

10 Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of section 4e-13 of the general statutes is
11 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*
12 *1, 2024*):

13 (a) The Department of Administrative Services, in consultation with

14 the State Contracting Standards Board, shall establish and maintain a
15 single electronic portal available on the Internet and located on the
16 Department of Administrative Services' Internet web site for purposes
17 of posting all contracting opportunities with state agencies in the
18 executive branch, the constituent units of the state system of higher
19 education and quasi-public agencies. Such electronic portal shall be
20 known as the State Contracting Portal.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:		
Section 1	<i>October 1, 2024</i>	4e-10(a)
Sec. 2	<i>October 1, 2024</i>	4e-13(a)
