OFA Fiscal Note

No Fiscal Impact

The amendment strikes the underlying bill and its associated fiscal impact.

The amendment, which requires the Department of Public Health (DPH), beginning 7/1/26, to include a sexual abuse and assault awareness prevention survey in each administration of its Connecticut School Health Survey, does not result in a fiscal impact to the agency. DPH must biennially administer the survey to students in grades nine through 12 if the department receives funding from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for it.

The amendment also replaces the phrase "child pornography" with "child sexual abuse material" and does not result in a fiscal impact. This change does not alter how individuals who commit this crime may be prosecuted or charged.

The preceding Fiscal Impact statement is prepared for the benefit of the members of the General Assembly, solely for the purposes of information, summarization and explanation and does not represent the intent of the General Assembly or either chamber thereof for any purpose.
