"AN ACT REQUIRING A REPORT CONCERNING HEALTH CARE PLANS, RETIREMENT PLANS AND OTHER BENEFITS PROVIDED BY NONSTATE PUBLIC EMPLOYERS."

1 After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and
2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (*Effective from passage*) The Comptroller, in collaboration
4 with a state-wide association of community nonprofit organizations,
5 shall conduct a study of costs associated with the provision of employee
6 health care benefits by nonprofit organizations that contract with the
7 state. Not later than February 1, 2026, the Comptroller shall submit a
8 report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general
9 statutes, to the joint standing committee of the General Assembly
10 having cognizance of matters relating to planning and development.
11 Such report shall include, (1) to the extent such information is available,
12 (A) the approximate total number of employees covered under health
13 care plans sponsored by such organizations, (B) the coverage types
14 selected by such covered employees, (C) the total premium for each

15 coverage type, inclusive of employee and employer shares and medical
 16 and pharmacy coverage, (D) the amounts of any contributions by such
 17 organizations to health savings or health reimbursement accounts, (E)
 18 the number of participants in such health care plans, including
 19 employee dependents, (F) a summary of benefits and coverage for
 20 health care plans offered by such organizations and the number of
 21 employees enrolled in such plans, and (G) information concerning
 22 retirement plans and benefits offered or provided by such organizations
 23 and the total costs to such organizations associated with the provision
 24 of such plans and benefits in the preceding year, and (2) (A) an analysis
 25 of the feasibility of permitting employees of such organizations to obtain
 26 coverage under a partnership plan, as defined in section 3-123aaa of the
 27 general statutes, (B) an analysis of the potential costs and benefits to
 28 such organizations participating in such plan, and (C) legislative
 29 recommendations to authorize the Comptroller to offer such coverage.
 30 Such report shall not contain the names of or other identifying
 31 information pertaining to any such organizations in connection with
 32 information included pursuant to subdivision (1) of this section."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
