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# Proposed Target Goals

Over next 3 years

-  Increase rate of diversion by 20%
-  Decrease recidivism rate by 10%
-  Decrease rate of incarceration by 30%

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# Charge of Work Groups

- Diversion work group
  - To develop a 3-year action plan to increase the rate of diversion by 20%
- Incarceration work group
  - To develop a 3-year action plan to decrease the rate of incarceration by 30%
- Recidivism work group
  - To develop a 3-year action plan to decrease recidivism rate by 10%
- Data interoperability work group
  - To be developed by the work group
